#### PRESIDENTS REPORT

The final number of Patrolling members for the season was in excess of 200. This bodes well for next season. We had 14 Patrol teams to cover this most important part of Surf Life Saving. Congratulations must go to those 75+ members who achieved 100% Patrol attendance for the season. Our Club also took part in the Patrol Assistance Program this year which saw a group of our young Bronze and SRC holders travel to Old Bar / Taree Surf Club to assist in Patrols for the weekend.

Our Director of Training and Education - Kevin Armstrong with assistance from Bob Powell, Andy Wing, Phil Harding, Pam and Jarryd Edmonds completed a record number of new Bronze holders as well as many ARTC and Crewpersons awards. Pam and Jarryd have also worked tirelessly putting through SRC recipients. Our team of trainers have also been responsible for ensuring our existing patrolling members are up to date with the latest requirements for patrolling our beach.

Our Club is fortunate to have a strong Rookie program with 46 Rookies this season. A special thank you to Michelle Krucler for ensuring our Rookies met all their obligations. Since the induction of the Rookie of the Month program, 3 of our Rookies have been fortunate enough to win.

On the competition front the Club got off to a flying start with winning the Branch Pool Challenge. The first carnival for the season at Forster saw the Club come away with an overall win. Throughout the season Umina colours were to be seen at all local, Branch, State and National carnivals, worn by our Nippers, Seniors and Masters with outstanding results at all events. This season we encouraged the more traditional lifesaving events with Paul Sharpe and Kerry Armstrong-Smith taking on the extra training. We had competitors represent the Club at Branch, State and Australian championships coming away with exceptional results at all three.

The Club competition results have been outstanding again this year thanks to the dedicated coaching team within our Club for all members. The camaraderie within our whole Club continues and is evidenced by the increase in members across the board. Special thanks must to go to our dedicated Officials and Water Safety Teams as without these members our competitive members could not compete.

We have just held our Junior and Senior Presentations and it was good to see such large numbers at both, with members having fun and the chance to celebrate achievements with their peers. The Senior Presentation night was made extra special for my wife and I being awarded Life Membership to Umina Surf Club.

The Club finishes the year with the excitement of what next season brings, we have a Surf Club deck extension in progress thanks to a Federal Government grant and the announcement that Umina and Ocean Beach Surf Clubs, with full support and assistance from Gosford City Council, will be jointly holding the State Surf Life Saving Titles for the next two years.

#### " Oh What A Season"

The 2011-12 season is now a chapter in our Club's history and one of which as "Club of the Year" our patrol standards reached new levels of excellence and our active patrol members reached record numbers. All patrol members: Rookies, Cadets and Bronze holders should be justifiably proud of the season just finished and of their individual and collective contributions.

Congratulations to all on a job extremely well done which is the result of unfailing commitment and dedication to our lifesaving duties. This ensured the safest possible environment for all visitors at all times to our beach.

The 2011-12 season stretched from the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of September to the last week of April and was made up of 146 patrols spread over 70 days and the wettest Surf season in recent times. Based on the feedback of patrol members via the 2010-11 end of the season survey, we reduced the number of patrols from 15 to 14 increasing numbers on each patrol to an average of 18 members inclusive of 15 Bronze. The increased numbers on patrols has worked well, resulting in an increasing number of patrols taking the opportunity to maintain and improve their Surf life saving skills without compromising our core function, the safety of general public. It has also allowed our Rookies to spend more quality time with their Buddies providing the optimum learning environment for our future lifesavers.

The popularity of our beach continues to rise with locals and visitors and from further afield. In spite of the overall poor weather the number of visitors during the season increased by 100,00 to 286,000.

Our training department has helped us as a Club be prepared to meet the increasing popularity of our beach, their expertise trained in excess of 50 new Bronze members during the season all of whom have taken to their patrols with commitment and dedication of seasoned veterans. Of significance was that 50% of our new Bronze holders came from our cadet ranks which is a tribute to the great work being done in the youth development area by people like Carl, Mick and Rick. The future of our Club is our youth, 62 of our 210 Bronze members are in the 15-21age bracket and we are reliant on their enthusiasm and zest for change and improvement to lead the next stage of our Club's development.

During the 2011-12 season we had 258 patrolling members made up of 210 bronze holders, 3 cadets and 45 rookies across 14 patrols. All significantly contributed to our beach's safety and to the statistics that were diligently recorded in both our logbooks and on Surf Guard which were.

- 7,137 patrolled Hours
- 286,015 visitors to our beach
- 8,440 Preventative Actions
- 138 Rescues
- 128 First Aids
- 9 Lost Children
- 2 Shark Alarms
- 3 Beach closures

Whilst there were some interesting moments at our beach that tested the skills and expertise of our patrolling members we had no major disasters and critically no loss of life. This is the result of the proactive commitment by all Patrol Captains and all patrol members to constantly improve their skills and to practice rescue and training scenarios as an integral part of their rostered patrols.

The commitment to personal improvement is also reflected in the very high numbers of Umina patrol members who attend formal Surf training courses to keep up with the ever changing world of Surf Life Saving and the demands by SLA for members to be abreast and skilled in all required proficiencies. Our Club has perhaps the most highly qualified Lifesavers on the Central Coast leading almost all of the awards categories. The quality of our training department and their dedication to training is something that we do not take for granted and we sincerely thank Kevin and the team for their wonderful contribution to our members and the Life Saving movement.

At times the juggle to fit family, professional and Surf commitments into members' schedules stretches us all to our limit and it is something that we should be aware off, keeping a balance in our lives so that we may perform at our best in each vital area. For the next 2 seasons our beach will host the State Surf Life Saving Championships which will further stretch the commitments of our Lifesavers, I have no doubt that with good planning, preparation and communication we will all be able to meet these extra challenges and provide memorable championships for all who visit our beach.

In every organisation there are always a few people behind the scenes that go the extra mile to make sure things happen. Our Club is indeed fortunate to have many of these wonderful people and is appropriate that they achieve the public kudos they deserve.

Our patrols would not have been as successful without the behind the scenes work of Andy Wing, Julia Rooke and Larissa Dixon. They provide the essential backup that keeps everything working in an efficient and professional manner.

Paul Sharpe and Kerry Armstrong-Smith have continued to maintain the focus on the traditional lifesaving events that has given many of our younger members an avenue of competition in Surf Life Saving that they may not have thought possible. These outstanding Champion Life Savers and First Aiders have also taken on leadership roles on their patrols passing on their skills for the benefit of all.

John Sharpe for his ongoing guidance, experience and knowledge that has helped make the carnivals held at our beach a tremendous success for all who took part and attended.

Peter Saxby and Danny Cunningham for their commitment and dedication to Water Safety supported by many of our patrol members. Danny, for organising the support weekend at Old Bar SLSC, it was a wonderful opportunity for our young lifesavers to make a difference at another beach. We look forward to future opportunities for such trips in the seasons ahead.

Mick and Carl for their work with the youth of our patrols, your efforts have been instrumental in maintaining the enthusiasm, commitment and focus of our wonderful young lifesavers and the tremendous growth in this critical section of our Club.

Alec and Aiden Arnold for the heroics that they performed for a train passenger on the way to patrol. The swift and professional manner in which they acted learnt as part of their life saving training undoubtedly saved the passenger's life, you are credit to yourselves, your parents and our Club.

Wills, Brock and Lachlan for the out of hours rescue, your assistance and expertise was the best Christmas present for a swimmer in difficulty at our beach.

Our CCSLA Rookies of the Month: Mollie, William and Lachlan.

Congratulations to all the members of Patrol 9 on winning Patrol of the Year. Mick and the team have set a very high standard over many years and were worthy winners of what was a very close competition.

Congratulations to all 77 of our 100% patrol attendance holders for managing to complete all of their rostered hours, which is no mean feat in lieu of the business of today's lifestyles. 24 of this group also managed to provide more than 60 patrol hours with 8 providing in excess of 100 hours of patrols.

Finally, congratulations to Richard Knight, our 2011-12 Patrol Person of the Year. Richard eptomises everything that Surf lifesaving is about, prepared to go the extra mile to help others without any thought of recognition or personal self-interest. We hope Richard that you are around to lead your patrol and contribute to the Club for many years to come.

The above is a brief overview of the achievements of our life saving activities over the past season, congratulations again to one and all. We hope our collective efforts will be enough to retain our Club of the year status. We look forward to seeing you all again in September when we get to do it all over again.








No. of Patrols







#### **Treasurers Report**

I would like to take this opportunity to say how much I enjoy being involved in Umina Surf Club and watching the Club grow. There have been many achievements our Club and its members have gained throughout the season, for example winning Central Coast Branch Club of the Year and then winning Central Coast Sports Federation Association of the Year. Bill and I were then nominated for Life Members of Umina Surf Club and felt very privileged and humble to have been awarded this honour.

The Club's Federal Government Community Infrastructure Grants Program of \$200,000.00 has seen the start of our Surf Club Deck extension and by the start of the new season 2012 – 2013 it should be complete.

As our Club continues to grow, so does the financial commitment towards the betterment of our members and their Club. The Club this year implemented a number of financial assistance programs for competitive members which we hope will help lessen the financial burden on families.

#### Senior Report - Under 15 to Open's

More growth has occurred this year in the numbers and involvement of our Seniors.

We started with a very large contingent competing at State Pool Rescue Championships with outstanding performances placing the Club 4<sup>th</sup> overall with 27 medal-winning results. Standouts being Teigan Miller 10 medals and Indigo Verhoeven 9 medals.

Next was National Pool Rescue Championships in Canberra where Umina fielded a team for the first time. Many results were impressive and again Teigan and Indigo were top achievers with 5 top 6 results each, especially noteworthy was that Indigo and Lara Reineker were competing against athletes up to 3 years older. Umina placed 18<sup>th</sup> overall

Interbranch Selection carnival saw a large number of the black, blue and white caps all over the arena with numerous top 6 placings by all of the 9 competitors.

We had a truly wonderful result by our select team of 6, being Mick Magurren, James Johnson, Claire Gaffney, Indigo Verhoeven, Teigan Miller and Helen Krucler at the Central Coast Pool Challenge, placing our Club 1<sup>st</sup> in the Branch, for the first time ever.

State Endurance Championships again saw Umina field their largest team ever. Noteworthy there was Hayley Braddish placing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 5km Beach Run – her first ever individual State Medal.

We had members compete at the East Coast Surf Festival over 3 rounds as well as Terrigal Twilight and the big Manly Carnival.

There was a huge representation at Open Branch Championships with resultant 30 medal-winning performances and further numerous top 6 placings with the effect of cementing the Club as clear 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Branch behind long term powerhouses Terrigal and Avoca.






