#### Rescue of the Month...



On Saturday 14 January at 6:30pm, Andrew Goodall an active member of The Lakes SLSC rescued a father and daughter who were struggling to stay afloat due to a strong rip. Andrew was walking along Lakes Beach when he identified two swimmers in trouble. The

father was attempting to keep his daughter above water while calling for Andrew's assistance. Without any hesitation, Andrew entered the water with no rescue equipment to help the swimmers out of the strong rip. The 14 year old girl was supported by Andrew and the father was being reassured that everything was okay. Due to Andrew not having any rescue equipment, he required the assistance of a nearby surfer who provided his board. The daughter laid on the board and was helped to shore by the surfer while both Andrew and the father swam beside them holding onto the board. Once they reached the shore, the teenager was showing signs of shock and started vomiting small amounts of water. Andrew immediately had a member of the public call triple zero while he took the patient to the first aid room and administered oxygen therapy. The girl was transported to Wyong Hospital due to low oxygen levels in her system and was showing signs of

shock. This is a great example of Andrew using the lifesaving skills he has been taught to save a life. Andrew's quick thinking and courage to enter the surf with no rescue equipment just shows that lifesavers are always ready to make a rescue when in need. Great work Andrew..!

Essential to this program is the integral support Mingara have contributed to the SLSCC Community Education Program for over 13 years, by providing much needed equipment, sun protection vests and surf safety brochures.
