PRESIDENT'S REPORT

PRESIDENTS REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present my first Presidents report.

As a club that has a history of 54 years of patrolling the beach and providing service to the community we are very fortunate to have such a long and proud heritage. The season of 2013/14 is such a small part of that heritage but it is the basic principles that have been adopted over those 56 years of putting the community first and maintaining our values as a family friendly club which makes the past season one that all members should be proud to have been a part of. This annual report provides the opportunity for us to review the achievements and contributions that have been made by our members over the last season.

Administration

The task of running a surf club with 1068 members in an era of ever increasing regulation and policy is, to say the least, a challenge. Fortunately our Administration Officer Christine Lavers loves a challenge and she has once again ensured that the club's administration, newsletters, member records, and any questions raised by members are attended to in a professional and timely manner. Thank you Christine for all that you do and we would be lost without you. Christine has been capably supported by the club's administrative assistant Larissa Dixon and she has been a great asset to the club as she goes above and beyond in providing support to members and the committee.

Finance

The financial management of our club has been undertaken by Club Treasurer Wendy Cook. During the season Wendy has implemented a new accounting system to assist with reporting and budgeting which has provided greater transparency to the committee about the club's financial performance. Thanks Wendy for all the hours you put into processing and managing our financial information and reporting. It was pleasing to see the club has continued to return a profit and that we are in a sound financial position.

Sponsorship

The ability of our club to maintain services on the beach is dependent upon the generous support from our club sponsors. We have once again been very fortunate with Club Umina, Merrylands RSL Club, Ettalong Beach Club, East Coast Roofing Supplies, Lance Clarke Amcal Chemist, Woy Woy Rotary, having continued as major sponsors of the club. Patrols

Our core activity of patrolling the beach was once again put to the test during the season when good weather brought many visitors to our beach. On many of the hottest days we also experienced challenging surf conditions which kept our patrols very busy. On behalf of all members I would like to thank our patrols for their dedication and vigilance as their efforts have maintained our proud record of 58 seasons of no lives lost whilst we have been patrolling the beach.

Our Director of Life Saving Nick Shepherd has spent many hours supporting the patrols and has done a great job in ensuring our rescue services operated efficiently. We were also very fortunate to have had continuity with most of our patrol captains from last season and their experienced leadership has assisted in maintaining our patrols to a high standard.

Education & Training

In order to have strong patrols it is essential that we have well trained lifesavers. Our education team headed up by our Chief Instructor Jarryd Edmonds under the guidance of Bob Powell has once again done an outstanding job in training members for their SRC, Bronze Medallion and higher awards. Apart from the countless hours spent by our team of instructors on these awards they also run member proficiency tests, undergo their own ongoing training and carry out assessing duties. Our club is very fortunate to have such a dedicated team and their quality of training is not only highly regarded at our club but also within Surf Lifesaving Central Coast. Well done to Jarryd and his team.

To all our new Bronze Medallion and other award recipients congratulations and I hope that you continue to be actively involved in the club.

IRB Section

Most club activities require IRB support and during the season our IRB drivers provided great service to all sections of the club. IRB Captain Andy Wing with the support of his drivers has worked miracles to ensure that we have had the necessary drivers and crews for patrols, carnivals and all club events. It is great to see some of the drivers preparing for the upcoming IRB racing season as it has been some years since the club has been represented in this competition. We also appreciate the support of Gosford City Council who provided the funding for a new motor this season.

Surf Sports

The 2013/14 season has seen our competitor numbers spread over a broader range of activities with more members participating in Life Saving events, the U/15-Open section and Masters Section. One of the new initiatives this season with Club Coach Brett Whyte has been the implementation of a new competition training structure for our U/15-Open competitors. This initiative together with the training activities being done in boats and lifesaving competition has been a very important step in transitioning our junior competitors through to the senior ranks of the club. Well done to Brett and all those involved in running the various sections and training.

Congratulations to all competitors who have represented the club through what seems to have been a long competition season, starting with the NSW Pool Rescue Event in July, Coolangatta Gold in November and culminating with the Australian Titles in April. At all carnivals and championships our competitors performed to the highest standard and the touring teams at Worlds and Aussies had a great time just being on tour together.

Junior Activities

The junior section of the club has had another big season in running Sunday morning Nipper activities and other events. This is not a simple task as we had some 450 Nipper members. Robert McLeod as Junior Activities Chairman and age managers did a great job in implementing change to ensure that Sunday morning activities ran to program and all those involved had a fun time.

Other Club Events and Activities

Club members once again assisted in the organisation and running of numerous club events and activities including the following:

The first round of the Streets Boat Carnival and Newcastle Permanent Junior Ironman were once again major events for the club and were well supported. Thanks go to John Sharpe, Andy Wing, Peter Saxby, Robert McLeod, Steve Murphy and their work parties for the efforts in ensuring these events were a great success.

The Woy Woy Pirates Ocean Swim, this event was a major success for the local swim club. Thanks go to Nick Shepherd, Bill Cook, Wendy Cook and all water safety.

The Ladies Night, this was a great event with monies raised going towards Ovarian Cancer Foundation. A cheque was presented in the way of \$1200 to this organisation; huge thanks go to Nicole McLeod, Skye Marshall, Karen Murphy, Cath Talty, Harold Marshall and all the ladies that attended that night.

The Club Golf Day was held in January at The Springs Golf Club to raise funds for the touring team uniforms for the season. Bill Cook and Robert McLeod did a wonderful job in organising what was an enjoyable day for members, guests and sponsors.

Surf Camp was held in January with 100 nippers in attendance fine tuning their skills under the close eye of our club coaches and Dean Simpson from Cronulla SLSC. This camp has become an important part of the junior development as the results in all carnivals show the benefits.

Rotary Youth Exchange was held for the fourth year with youth from around the world attending our beach; this program allows our youth to interact with different nationalities and cultures that our young people can use later in life. I would like to thank Carl Krucler and all our young people that attended and made this event so special for our visitors.

NSW State Championships was held in March this was a fantastic spectacle seeing the best competitors the state has to offer. This was the most proud moment of the year for myself seeing the club pull together from nipper's right through to our life members working side by side to put on the best event in the state. Thanks go to the Local Organising Committee; Brett Harrod, Robert Langford, Daniel Cunningham, Garry Mensforth, John Sharpe, David Thompson, Elaine Unger, Belinda Thompson, Mark Arahill. Umina SLSC had submitted hosting the 2012-2013 State Titles as their nomination for “Event of the Year” and took out this award at the Central Coast Sports Federation Awards night. This award was very prestigious as we were up against many other major sporting organisations on the Central Coast. Thanks to all the hard work that our members had contributed in the lead up to and during this event which made winning this possible.

Under 15 Australian & State Gold Medallist

Jemma Smith is the first Under 15 competitor from Umina SLSC to win 2 Gold medals at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships and also 2 Gold medals at the Australian Pool Rescue Challenge as well as winning the Sydney Water Series against many clubs from all over NSW. Jemma is a multiple State medallist in individual and team events listed in the Annual Report results pages. We wish to congratulate Jemma and enthusiastically support her in attaining these fantastic results.

Jasmine Darwin was selected as the “Junior Lifesaver of the Year” for the Central Coast. As the result of winning this award Jasmine was then required to attend a SLSNSW camp for all other nominees from other NSW Surf Clubs in a selection process to ultimately achieve the NSW Titles. Unfortunately Jasmine did not win outright but in a count back the selection committee decided due to her great qualities and dedication to Surf Life Saving she would be awarded a special commendation from SLSNSW.

TREASURERS REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the Financial Report for Umina Surf Club.

It is with much mixed emotions that I will not be standing again at the AGM for the Treasurers position. Bill & I took on the Treasurers position when the then Treasurer resigned in January 2003-2004 season. While for the past few years we form part of the grey nomad travellers in the off season, we find it is time for us to start doing more travelling.

We have watched the club grow from approx 400 members to over 1000 this season, with the largest nipper numbers on the Central Coast. With the increasing growth within the club a number of financial assistance programs have been implemented for members of our club for which we hope will help lessen the financial burden on families. These included an Equipment Sponsorship, Scholarship program, part of our Lease agreement with the Club Kiosk (See Lion Cafe) is to provide our Patrolling members lunch throughout the season. This sponsorship was approx \$8,000.00 this year. Also to accommodate for the growth within our club ongoing Grants have been applied for in this period. A few of those Grants applied for were: Deck extension to our Surf Club \$200,000.00 from the Federal Government, a new Bin Enclosure for the Surf Club \$8,000.00 Federal Government and Security Camera Installation \$5,000.00 Gosford City Council.

The Club would like to once again thank all our loyal sponsors and supporters for their continued support this year, without their ongoing support the running of our Surf Club including the purchase of new equipment for our members would not be possible.

Our major sponsors for this year were Club Umina, Merrylands RSL, Ettalong Beach War Memorial Club, Lance Clarke Amcal Chemist, Woy Woy Rotary, Central Coast Surf Life Saving & New South Wales Surf Life Saving. We would also like to thank the many loyal local businesses and individuals that have also supported us throughout the year. (As per full list below)

With the support from our sponsors this year the club has continued to subsidise memberships, and further advanced training of existing and new members. The club has also updated Life Saving Equipment and competition equipment incl., Motors, Rescue Boards, nipper boards, competition mals and skis, and the new high visibility vest required to be worn by all competitors.

Our Hall Hire bookings have been steady with an increase starting to show with the completion of the new Deck with bookings through the off season. Umina Surf Club also provides its Surf Club Hall to other community / sporting organisations at varying discounted rates.

The Hall Hire and the Kiosk continue to provide a steady income towards the increasing running costs of the Surf Club. The financial assistance from the Hall Hire has also allowed the club to employ a Venue Manager and an Office Administrator on casual basis.

Umina Surf Club finds itself in a sound financial situation with procedures in place for the growth of our club. With the correct management and continuing development the financial stability of the surf club should be sound for many years to come.

Umina Surf Life Saving Club Inc. financials for the year have been audited by registered auditors Cassin Services Pty Ltd.

I would personally like to thank everyone for their support during my time as Treasurer, I have had a memorable trip during this time. On a Club level I have seen the Club receive Central Coast Surf Life Saving Club of the Year a number of times, win Association of the Year through Central Coast Sports Federation and also win Central Coasts Sports Federation Event of the Year – New South Wales State Surf Life Saving Titles. On a personal note I have being name Umina Surf Club Person of the Year (twice), I received Life Membership to our Surf Club and last year winning Central Coast Volunteer of the Year. It is through your support and club mateship that these awards were bestowed to me and I Thank You for the many memories.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING

“What a wonderful season!”

The 2013-14 season has run its course and is now a chapter in our Club’s proud history. The season past was one as “Host Club of the NSW State Championships” for the second successive year which saw us successfully meet the logistical challenges of operating with limited club facilities for a month and saw our patrol standards reach new levels of excellence and our active patrol members reach new record numbers.

To all of our 262 bronze members, rookies and cadets who should be justifiably proud of the season just finished and of their individual and collective contributions that enabled the season pass without any major incidents during the 9,022 patrolled hours.

Congratulations to all patrol members on a job well done as a consequence result of the unfailing commitment and dedication to our lifesaving duties. This ensured the safest possible beach and aquatic environment for the record number of visitors to our beach.

The past season started on 21st September and concluded on the last Sunday of April which whilst this caused some concerns for the large number of patrol members involved in winter sports the willingness of the remainder to assist ensured that all patrols had large numbers with the requisite skill sets.

In all the 2013-14 season was comprised of 142 patrols spread over 72 days. Based on the feedback of patrol members via the 2012-13 end of the season survey, we increased the number of patrols by one, totalling 15 whilst maintaining the numbers on each patrol to circa 15 Bronze members to provide a better spread of the requisite competencies, thus enabling each patrol to be better equipped to do its job.

In recent seasons the increased numbers on patrols has worked well, allowing more patrols to take the opportunity to maintain and improve their surf life saving skills without compromising our core function, the safety of the general public. It has also allowed our Rookies to spend more quality time with their mentors providing the optimum learning environment for our future lifesavers.

Umina Beach continues to be an increasingly popular spot for visitors from both within and from outside the Peninsula and a total 329,585 people visited the beach during the rostered patrol season, a significant increase over previous years.

During the past season we had 262 bronze patrolling members, 11 cadets and 31 rookies across the 15 patrols. Due to the constraints of holding the NSW State Championships and the forced break in their training of 1 month we ran out of patrols for the second bronze group of 8 new members but they will be joining on patrols next season. We look forward to their added skills, enthusiasm and expertise boosting our patrols during the upcoming and many seasons thereafter.

All of our patrolling members significantly contributed to our beach's safety and to the statistics that were diligently recorded in both our logbooks and on Surf Guard which were;

- 9,022 patrolled Hours
- 329,585 visitors to our beach
- 18,747 Preventative Actions
- 41 Rescues
- 143 First Aids
- 64 Lost Children with 2 searches
- 4 Shark Alarms
- 3 Beach closures

We cannot understate the value of our training department and the assistance and support that they provide to all patrolling members. Their dedication and expertise has helped us as a Club be prepared to meet the increasing popularity of our beach, they also trained an additional 61 new bronze members during the season, all of whom have taken to their patrols with the commitment and dedication of seasoned veterans.

Of significance is the ongoing retention of our Bronze holders particularly in our 15-18 years age group which both continues to grow (over the last 5 seasons this critical section of our patrolling members tripled from 19 to 58) and is a fitting tribute to the great work being done in the youth development area by the likes of Carl, Mick, Rick, Brett, Kerry and Paul.

The future of our club is our strong and vibrant youth section; we are reliant on your enthusiasm and zest for change and improvement to lead the next stage of our club's development. Seize the day and become even more involved in leading the club.

Whilst there were some interesting moments at our beach that tested the skills and expertise of our patrolling members we had no major disasters and critically no loss of life. This is the result of the proactive commitment by all Patrol Captains and all patrol members to constantly improve their skills and to practice rescue and training scenarios as an integral part of their rostered patrols. Of special mention for their gusto in this area is our patrol of the year, Patrol 9, who during the Sunday of the State Masters Carnival were so realistic in their conducting of rescue scenarios that the State Match Referee thought that a real rescue was in progress at the Southern end of our beach and dispatched the Central Coast Duty Officer to investigate.

The commitment to personal improvement is also reflected in the very high numbers of Umina patrol members who attend formal surf life saving training courses to keep up with the ever changing world of Surf Life Saving and the demands by SLSA for members to be abreast and skilled in all required proficiencies. Our Club has perhaps the most highly qualified Life Savers on the Central Coast leading almost all of the awards categories. The quality of our training department and their dedication to their role is something that we do not take for granted and we sincerely thank Bob, Jarryd and the whole team for their wonderful contribution to our members and the Life Saving movement.

At times the juggle to fit family, professional and surf commitments into members' schedules stretches us all to our limit and it is something that we should be aware of, keeping a balance in our lives so that we may perform at our best in each vital area.

This season we hosted the NSW State Surf Life Saving Championships for the second consecutive year which further stretched the commitments of our Life Savers, we are sincerely indebted to all who patrolled on the additional hours of the Championships. I have no doubt that with good planning, preparation and communication we will all be able to meet these extra challenges of next year's Championships providing another memorable experience for all who visit our beach.

In every organisation there are always a few people behind the scenes that go the extra mile to make sure things happen. Our club is indeed fortunate to have many of these wonderful people and it is appropriate that they achieve the public kudos they deserve.

Our patrols would not have been as successful without the behind the scenes work of Andy Wing and Larissa Dixon. They provide the essential backup that keeps everything working in an efficient and professional manner.

Paul Sharpe and Kerry Armstrong-Smith have continued to maintain the focus on the traditional lifesaving events that has given many of our younger members an avenue of competition in Surf Life Saving that they may not have thought possible. These outstanding Champion Life Savers and First Aiders have also taken on leadership roles on their patrols passing on their skills for the benefit of all.

John Sharpe for his ongoing guidance, experience and knowledge which was critical for our organising team that again have made the State Championships held at our beach a tremendous success for all who took part and attended.

Peter Saxby and Danny Cunningham for their commitment and dedication to Water Safety supported by many of our patrol members. With the most nippers in our Branch we need all of the support that our wonderful Bronze provide in addition to their normal rostered patrols

Brett Whyte, Carl Krucler and Mick Magurren for their work with the youth of our patrols in the competition area of surf sports, your efforts have been instrumental in maintaining the enthusiasm, commitment and focus of our wonderful young lifesavers and the tremendous growth in this critical section of our club.

Rick Boylan, Ashley Dean and Tom Magurren for organising and leading the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze group of 30 of our younger patrol members. Your dedication and commitment to excellence in planning and execution of the award programme will have a profound effect on these fortunate young members of our club and stand them in good stead for the rest of their lives.

Congratulations to all the members of Patrol 9 on winning Patrol of the Year. John Bowyer and the team have set a very high standard over many years and were worthy winners of what was a very close competition.

Congratulations to all 77 of our 100% patrol attendance holders for managing to complete all of their rostered hours, which is no mean feat in lieu of the business of today's lifestyles. 13 of this group also managed to provide more than 60 patrol hours with 3 providing in excess of 100 hours of patrols.

Our Club's 2013-14 Patrol Person of the Year, Steve Dixon epitomises everything that surf lifesaving is about, prepared to go the extra mile to help others without any thought of recognition or personal self-interest. Steve has made significant contributions to our training and life saving departments and we hope that you are around to lead by your example and continue to contribute to the Club for many years to come.

Best of luck to our life saving nominees for the Central Coast Awards of Excellence, Warren Whitney and Jess Thomas regardless of the outcome in early June your efforts have been phenomenal.

Allocation of boards

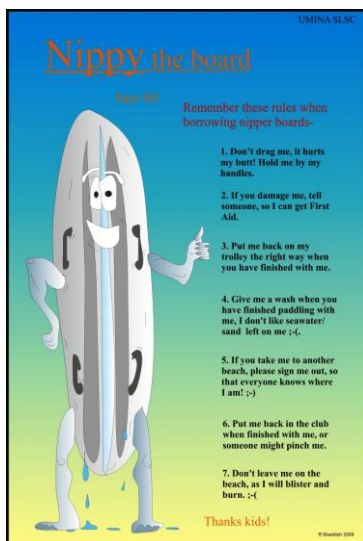

The aim of this Rookie program is to provide the U/13's & 14's with hands-on patrol experience, to learn rescue & lifesaving skills, to understand the surf lifesaving philosophy, to bridge the 'gap' between Juniors & Seniors and to learn how rewarding it is to serve the community.

During the program the Rookies are required to complete minimum of 20 patrol hours, to gain their SRC when they are 13 years old, to attend Rookie events, to wear their Rookie uniform while on patrols and to regularly fill in their rookie passports. 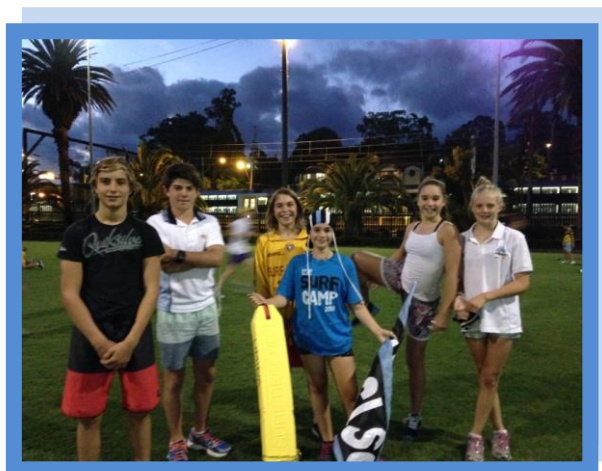

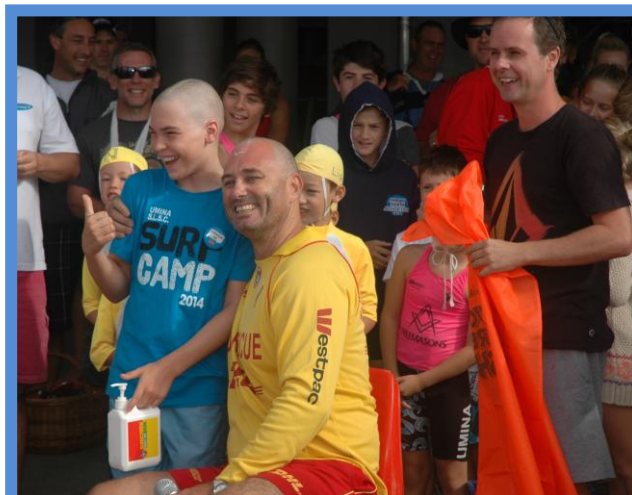

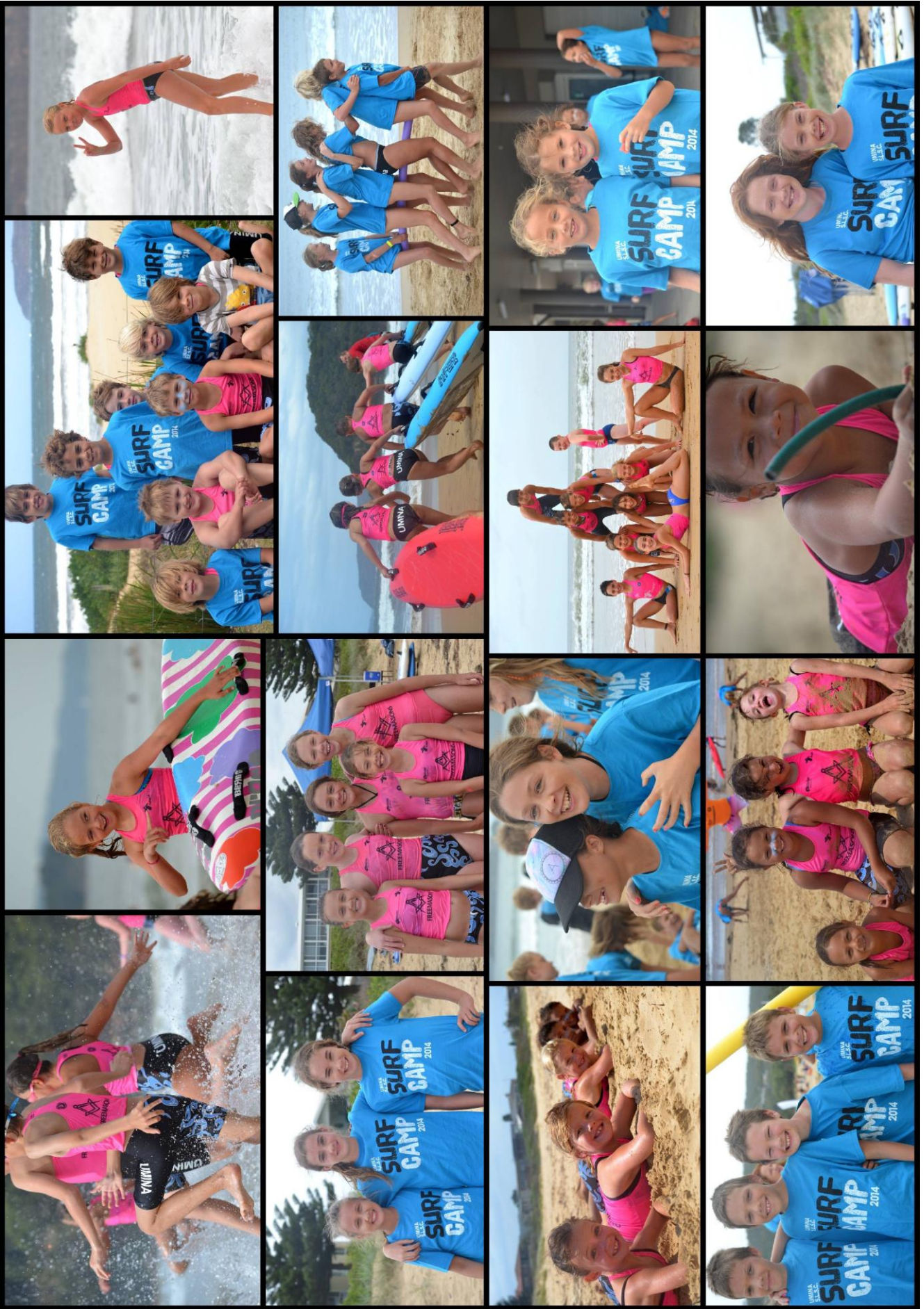
I told my wife when I started the job that my aim was to know every Nippers name. Even though I didn't achieve this goal, I think I gave it a pretty good shake.
