The season 2016/17 was another small chapter in our long and proud history of 58 seasons of patrolling the beautiful Broken Bay and providing a service to the community in many different ways. Our surf club as it operates today is a very diverse organisation with a diverse membership carrying out a diversity of functions. This report encapsulates the achievements of our members and provides a record for the present and the future of another successful season in our club's history.

Life Saving

The sight of our members dressed in their red and yellow uniforms patrolling our beach provides great comfort to the bathing public who feel safe in the knowledge there are skilled and qualified people to assist them should they get into difficulties whilst at the beach.

The club's record of 58 seasons of no lives lost whilst patrolling the beach continues to stand and is a true testament to our patrolling members who were tested to the maximum at times throughout the season when we had large crowds and difficult surf conditions. Thank you to all our patrolling members.

Our patrol numbers were strong and despite a number of our experienced Patrol Captains stepping down at the end of last season we were very grateful to members prepared to step into this pivotal role. Once again, our Patrol Captains' provided great leadership skills on the beach and were also a great support to our Director of Life Saving.

Jessica has spent countless hours and done a wonderful job in her management of the patrols and all ancillary activities ensuring our patrols ran efficiently.

Sadly, Jessica has decided not to continue in this role and we thank her for her dedication over the last two seasons but I am sure she will be around to assist where required.

Education

Without well trained lifesavers our patrols would not be equipped to carry out their essential functions. The ongoing training for the SRC, Bronze Medallion and higher awards has virtually become a 12-month activity. In order to have strong patrols it is essential that we have well trained lifesavers. Our education team headed up by our Chief Instructor Natasha Swain under the guidance of Bob Powell has once again done outstanding job in training members for their SRC, Bronze Medallion and higher awards. Apart from the countless hours spent by our team of instructors on these awards they also run member proficiency tests, undergo their own ongoing training and carry out assessing duties. Our club is very fortunate to have such a dedicated team and their quality of training is not only highly regarded at our club but also within Surf Lifesaving Central Coast. Well done to Natasha, Bob and their team.

To all our new Bronze Medallion and other award recipients' congratulations and I hope that you continue to be actively involved in the club.

Surf Sports

Competition and training activities continue to be a major focus for many members and it is pleasing to see members participating in all disciplines of competition and training.

The 2016/17 season has seen our competitor numbers spread over a broader range of activities with more members participating in all surf sports events, the U/15-Open section and Masters Section. It's also appropriate in this report that I acknowledge the great work of our Surf Sports team which is headed up by Brett Harrod and it's a credit to him, Head Coach Trevor Gee and all the other coaches and supporters who are there not only to coach, but also mentor and encourage all our competitors from Masters to Nippers. The area continues to grow from strength to strength.

- · Watching the Umina athletes on TV in the Summer of Surf Series.
- · Jemma Smith efforts in the Nutri Grain series and all the supporters that travelled down to support.
- · The efforts of all competitors at the NSW State Titles at Swansea Belmont in trying conditions
- · The Under 19 Women's Taplin that completed a first by winning their age then returning to the line for the Blue-ribbon event of the Championship the Open Women's Taplin and digging deep to be victorious in this event against a strong Newport team.
- ·The performance of Lachlan Braddish at Australian Titles winning the swim, Ironman and part of the all-conquering surf team with Lachlan Mcleod, Brock Ray and Blake Hessel.
- · A first for the club all youth and senior competitors that competed at the Australian Titles made Australian finals.
- · All the masters that competed at all carnivals this season at local carnivals branch, State and Australian

Congratulations to all competitors who have represented the club through what seems to have been a long competition season, starting with the NSW Pool Rescue Event in July, Coolangatta Gold October and culminating with the Australian Titles in April. At all carnivals and championships our competitors performed to the highest standard.

Special thanks must to go to our dedicated Officials and our IRB team as without these members our competitive members could not compete.

Junior Activities (Nippers)

The club's Junior Activities section was once again one of the largest in the Central Coast Branch. The logistical responsibilities of running Sunday morning Nipper events and other Nipper activities is a huge task. We have been fortunate to have had Harold Marshall in the role of Junior Chairman for the season and who has very capably managed this responsibility. Harold has been well supported by all junior age managers and age secretaries they have ensured our Nipper members have had a successful and enjoyable season.

The ethos that we as a club are made up of members from 5 years of age to our oldest members in their late 70's is very strong and the cohesion that we are one club has now become well entrenched as we focus on ensuring our young members have a clear pathway through the club.

Youth Development.

The progression of members from juniors and rookies into the senior ranks of the club has been a key initiative that Rookie Coordinator Peter Talty has been concentrating on over the last season. The involvement of our youth in training for awards, improving their surf skills, being involved in competition and other club activities has been part of the plan that Peter has looked to implement. Administration

In addition, they continue to answer numerous member questions.

Finance

Another significant task for a club of our size is the financial management which has been well looked after by Wendy Cook our Club Treasurer and we thank you for your dedication to get all of the finances back to governance standards which was a huge task. Wendy has provided the club with monthly financial reporting and budgets to assist the committee in making ongoing decisions. These statistics are put into surf guard every week from the patrol log book that we should be completing every patrol.

- Approx. 150,000 Visitors
- 132 Rescues
- 95 First aids
- Lost children
- 3920 Preventions

Once again, our patrol captains have done an amazing job showing professionalism and also a quick response to any incidences that have occurred. They have all welcomed new award holders onto their patrols with open arms and this is greatly appreciated.

Huge thanks must go out to our call out team this season. Their reaction time and alertness means that we have a quick response to any incidences that occur. This season we had received many positive comments from not only the duty officers but also the Director of Lifesaving for SLSCC. This again shows the professionalism of Umina Bronze and award holders.

As technology is improving Surf Lifesaving is also coming up with ways to make our lives a lot easier on the beach and ultimately preventing us from spending unnecessary time speaking to Surfcom, which has been an issue in the past. An initiative that has been introduced last season is the Patrol App. This app can now be downloaded on a phone or tablet and is used in the same way that the patrol logs have been used. They can sign you and the patrol on, can record rescues and pinpoint the exact location of flags with only a touch of a button. I know this season a couple of patrols have used this app and hopefully by next season all patrol captains will be using this app.

The high standard of bronze and award holders is thanks to our amazing trainers and assessors. Thanks to Pam and Jarryd for training the SRC's and preparing them for their

final exam. These young lifesavers all passed with flying colours, this was also one of the biggest groups that has come through in many years! The bronze holders they have trained this season have all been knowledgeable, enthusiastic and ready to learn even more on their patrols.

Our club is in a sound financial situation with us continually assessing and updating procedures for the growth within our club. With the correct management and continuing development, the financial stability of the surf club should be sound for many years to come.

The Club has financial assistance programs implemented that have seen the club continue to strengthen and grow. These included an Equipment Sponsorship, part of our Lease agreement with the Umina Beach Cafe is to provide our Patrolling members lunch throughout the season. This sponsorship was approx. \$9,500.00 this year. Also, to accommodate for the growth within our club ongoing Grants are continually being applied for to assist in the club expansion.


This year we also received several new rescue boards and which allowed us to donate some of our older boards to be used by community group helping young people become surf aware.














IRB Captain | Jimmy Irwin & Stephen Reid
