Well that's a wrap for another patrolling season at Umina SLSC. The Red & Yellow Flags came down for the last time in the 2017/18 Season on Sunday 29 April 2018, signifying the end to a challenging but successful season. The Red & Yellow Flags went up for the first time on Saturday 19 September 2018 and since then Umina members have patrolled every weekend and public holiday, through rain, hail and shine to ensure the safety of the general public who come down to enjoy the best beach in Australia.

Firstly, I want to take this opportunity to thank every Umina member who spent their time on the beach patrolling this season. We are first and foremost a Surf Life Saving Club, and our core business is patrolling. Without our patrolling members, our club couldn't exist. Each member's contribution to patrols played a part in Umina SLSC maintaining its proud record of 'No Lives Lost'.

The season started off in typical fashion with the core lifesaving team drawing a short breath between the 2016/17 season ending and the planning and preparation for the current 2017/18 season commencing. This year saw a changing of the guard with Jessica Thomas, our previous Director of Lifesaving/Club Captain, stepping down. Jessica served the club selflessly over her 2 years in the role.

Umina SLSC Lifesaving Committee

This year saw the creation of our new Umina SLSC Lifesaving Committee. Lifesaving as a whole continues to grow every year and I have been extremely fortunate to be supported by such a talented and dedicated team behind me. It is often said that 'volunteers don't necessarily have the time, but they have the heart', and this group of people exemplify that. The Lifesaving Committee was composed of a small group of dedicated patrolling members who each took on an area of responsibility within Lifesaving at Umina, in addition to their regular patrol duties. The committee met regularly to discuss our current operations and shape the future direction of Lifesaving at Umina SLSC.

I wish to personally thank Skye Marshall, James Irwin, Kai Darwin, Steven Duxbury, Grace Talty and all the patrol captains who all worked very hard within their roles this season and made great contributions to the club.

Patrols

Patrols were kept very busy this season with overall beach attendance up 50,000 from last season, to in excess of 198,271 people.

Combined, our members volunteered an incredible 10,303 patrol hours this season. To place that in perspective, that's in excess of 430 days of combined patrolling hours. This constant diligence saw Preventative Actions up by 5000 to 9207 and ensued that we continued our record of no lives lost between the flags at Umina.

The 2017/18 Season saw our members undertake in excess of 46 rescues, with more than half of those using a rescue tube or rescue board. We attended to more than 135 first aid incidents and reunited more than 20 lost children with their parents. The season saw us perform 95 first aids during patrol hours, a marked increase from previous seasons, and numerous outside of our rostered hours.

Thanks must go to our Patrol Captains, Robert Powell, Kerry Armstrong –Smith, Jacqui Knight, Steven Duxbury, Ashlee Dean, Warren Whitney, John Bowyer, Steve Thomas, David Bishop, Skye Marshall, Rick Boylan, David Gaffney, Steve Murphy who are always first on the beach and last off the beach on any given patrolling day.

Thanks to Water Safety Coordinator Michael Caller for the nipper season.

I couldn't function in my position as Director of Lifesaving, and patrols couldn't function effectively without the support, guidance and professionalism of our Patrol Captains.

Patrol Audits

As part of the on-going Surf Life Saving Central Coast Patrol Audit Program, Umina SLSC patrols were audited 4 times throughout the season. The Patrol Audits form part of the SLSCC quality assurance program for patrols and assess Umina's adherence to the lifesaving standard operating procedures as well as the patrols competency in resuscitation and rescue readiness. Our patrols performed admirably on each occasion, scoring very well which places us in good stead against the other clubs within the branch internal patrol audit competition.

The 2017/18 season saw the implementation of numerous initiatives which aim to further recognise the volunteer contributions our members make in patrolling at Umina. A number of processes have been put in place to support members in meeting their patrol obligations with the club and these have been well received by our patrolling members. I'm already looking forward to next season and the seasons beyond when we can continue to phase in more exciting changes.

Education

At Umina, we wouldn't have new patrolling members or sufficient patrols without the tireless work of our education team, led by our Director of Education Robert Powell. Robert and his education team have trained 40 new Bronze Medallion members and 32 new Surf Rescue Certificate members who have enthusiastically joined our patrol teams this season. Robert has been a mentor and personal friend over the years at Umina and as he steps down from his current role, I wish to thank him for his selfless service to the club as Chief Instructor over the past 12 seasons.

Final Word

As the sand settles on the 2017/18 Season I want to take this final opportunity to thank our Patrolling members on another successful season. Umina SLSC maintained its proud and longstanding record of no lives lost, and I think we managed to have a bit of fun along the way.

I look forward to seeing everyone back on the best beach in Australia next season and wish everyone a safe and enjoyable off season.

Umina Surf Life Saving Club Inc. financials for the year have been audited by registered auditors Fortunity Pty Ltd.

Our club is in a sound financial situation with us continually assessing and updating procedures for the growth within our club. With the correct management and continuing development, the financial stability of the surf club should be sound for many years to come.

The Club has financial assistance programs implemented that have seen the club continue to strengthen and grow. These included an Equipment Sponsorship, part of our Lease agreement with the Umina Beach Cafe is to provide our Patrolling members lunch throughout the season. This sponsorship was approx. \$10,500.00 this year. Also, to accommodate for the growth within our club ongoing Grants are continually being applied for to assist in the club expansion. We have just received our DA consent to expand and a grant application has been submitted. Ability Links have come on board with assistance for our walkway and viewing area and this is to be laid over the winter.

Friendship, teamwork, dedication and commitment to achieving our goals were once again the pillars of our very successful Surf Sports program for the 2017/18 season. With this season being the culmination of the 5-year plan instigated by our Surf Sports Director Brett Harrod along with our Head Coach Trevor Gee, we saw the largest number of participants involved in training sessions and in competitions in our senior ranks in the most diverse range of events our club has seen for a very long time.

This season saw Umina S.L.S.C represented in all areas of Surf Sport competition including: Nipper carnivals, master's carnivals, First Aid carnivals, Board and Ski Series, Newcastle Permanent Iron person races, Ocean 6 series, Nutri-Grain Iron person finals, Peters Boat series, IRB premierships as well as the major carnivals: Branch Titles, State and Australian titles in both Pool Rescue, Lifesaving and Ocean events. 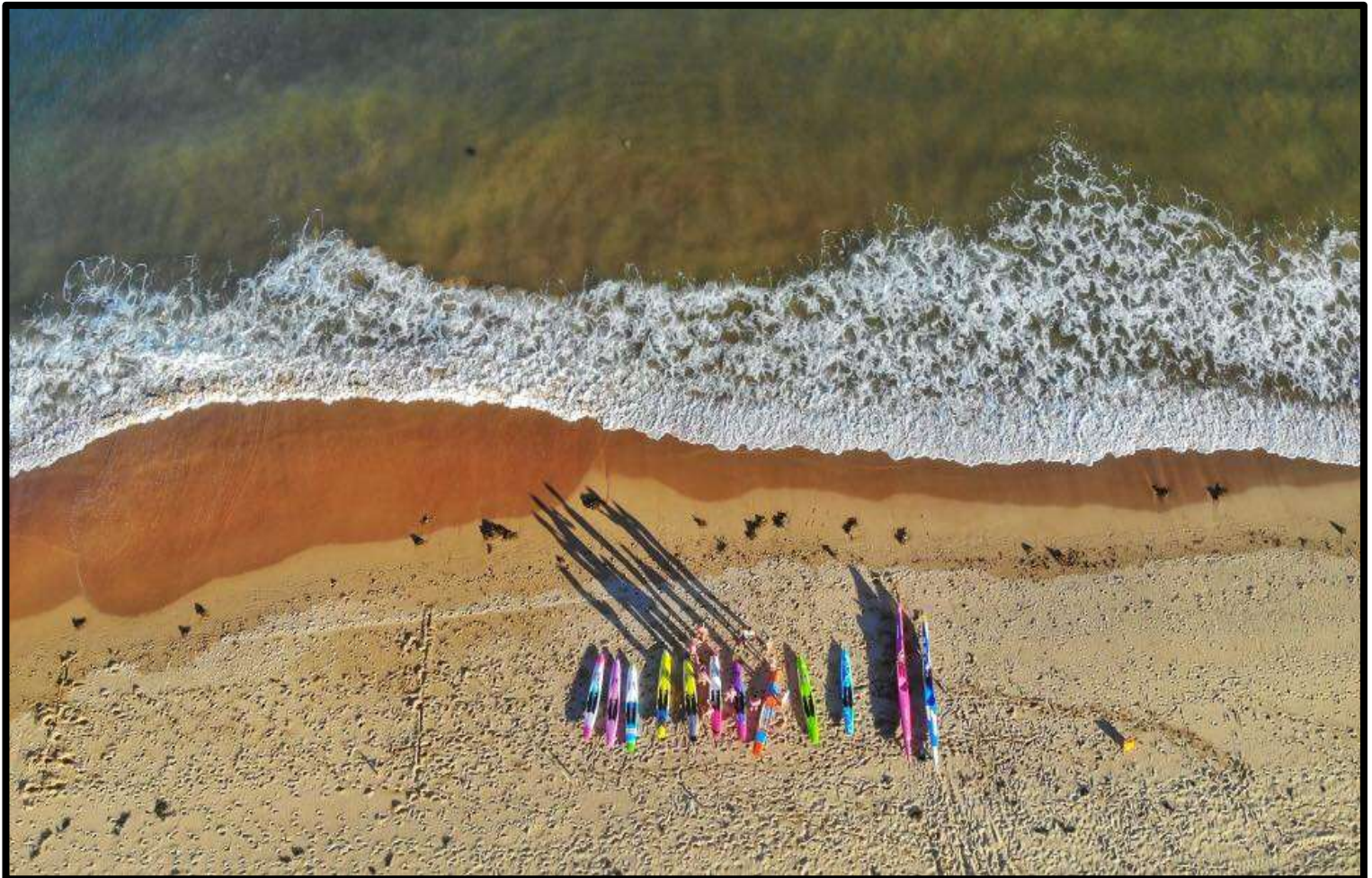

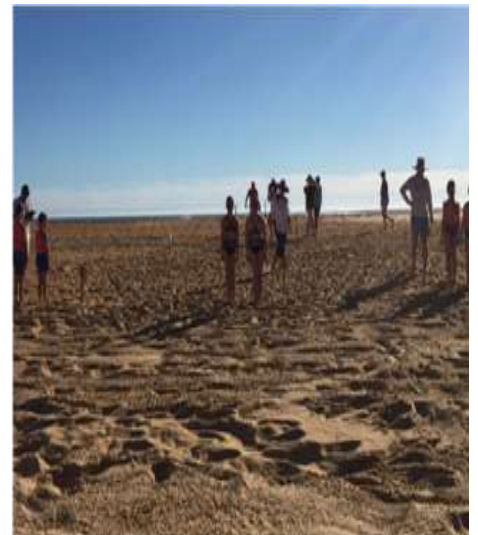

And every week there were plenty of parents, grandparents, or friends to help out - even when the conditions weren't the best. A big thanks to all those that helped or supported to make the season such a great one.

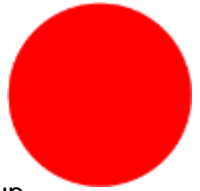
