President Report

It is with pride that I present the Umina SLSC Annual Report for 2012 - 2013 on behalf of our Club Executive and Management committee members within our club.

Umina SLSC would like to thank the many local businesses who continue to support and sponsor our Club, without their generous assistance the purchase of life saving, education and competition equipment would be limited and difficult.

Our year started off with the completion of the New Deck to our Surf Club ready for the start of the surf season. All thanks go to Kelly Glew and the Building Committee. Our Deck was made possible through a Community Infrastructure Grant from the Australian Government, Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport.

I would like to thank Nick Shepherd - Club Captain and Paul Sharpe - Vice Club Captain for a tremendous season. There Patrols have patrolled our beach without any major incident for the season and with the final number of patrolling members for the season in excess of 250 members which will be great for next season. We had a team of 14 patrols to cover this most important part of Surf Life Saving. Congratulations must go to those 70+ members that achieved 100% Patrol attendance for the season.

Umina Surf Club gave recognition at our senior Presentation to our long standing patrolling members we awarded: 2 - 30yrs, 2- 25yrs, 2 - 20yrs, 7 - 15yrs and 11 - 10yrs through the National Patrol Awards this showing commitment to a local voluntary organisation and commitment to our surf club and the surf lifesaving movement.

Our Director of Training and Education - Bob Powell with assistance from the clubs many trainers have worked hard training a number of new Bronze, ARTC, Crewpersons, IRB, Spinal, and Radio awards with a total of over 520 requals and 125 new awards. Pam & Jarryd have also worked tirelessly putting through SRC recipients again this season. Apart from this they have upgraded existing patrolling members to the latest requirements needed for patrolling our Beach.

Our Rookie program is strong within our club having 46 Rookies this season so special thanks to Rachel & Nicole Funnell for ensuring our Rookies met all their obligations.

On the competition front the Club got off to a flying with winning the Branch Pool Challenge. Throughout the season Umina colours were to be seen at all local, branch, state, national and world surf & pool titles by our Nippers, Seniors and Masters with outstanding results at all events. Our club has some very dedicated coaches who put in a lot of time training our members from Nippers, Seniors & Master competitors a big Thank You must go to them. This season Umina SLSC had outstanding results at all major Surf Life Saving Carnivals starting with the NSW State Pool, NSW State Endurance, NSW State Surf, Australian Surf, Australian Pool, Worlds Surf and Worlds Surf Life Saving Pool.

Traditional Event - Champion Lifesaver - strong results through Branch, State and Australian Championships. Exceptional results were achieved at the **Australian Championships** by the 4 Umina SLSC members - Kerry Armstrong-Smith 1st, Jemma Smith 1st, Christine Bishop 2nd, Teigan Miller 2nd. Other outstanding results were Kerry Armstrong-Smith 1st 40 – 44 ski. **World Titles** – Michael Magurren, Gary Mathews and Rick Boylan 3rd 130+ Board Relay, Michael Magurren & Tom Magurren 3rd Rope Throw, Kerry Armstrong-Smith 1st 40 – 44 ski, Kerry Armstrong-Smith & Christine Bishop 35 – 39 3rd Board Rescue.

The Club competition results have been outstanding again this year due to the dedicated coaching team within our club for all members. The camaraderie within our whole club continues and is evident with the continued increase in members across the board. As special thanks has to go to our dedicated Officials and Water Safety Team as without these members our competitive members could not compete.

Our Club has got the Duke of Edinburgh back up and running with a large interest from our young members within the club in the program. We have 25 young members who have done their trial camp and will be doing their final Camp with Kayaking on the June Long Weekend.

We have just had our Junior & Senior Presentation and it was good to see such large numbers at both with members having fun and the chance to celebrate achievements with their peers. Major Awards - Life Member Andrew Wing, Club Person - Danny Cunningham & Warren Whitney, Under 19 Club Person - Jessica Thomas, Patrol Person Christine Bishop & Savannah Paterson.

Our Club with Ocean Beach jointly held the NSW State Titles this year and we look forward to the State Titles being held at our beach for another year (knowing we could not have conditions the same again)

We would like to acknowledge support from Central Coast Branch led by Chris Parker and Stuart Harvey and Gosford City Council in particular Phil Moore and Craig Healy for their assistance throughout the season.

Director of Lifesaving Report

“ What a remarkable Season”

The 2012-13 season is now a chapter in our Club’s proud history. The season past was one as “Club of the Year” for the second successive year saw our patrol standards reach new levels of excellence and our active patrol members reach record numbers.

All patrol members: rookies, cadets and Bronze holders should be justifiably proud of the season just finished and of their individual and collective contributions.

Congratulations to all patrol members on a job well done as a consequence result of the unfailing commitment and dedication to our lifesaving duties. This ensured the safest possible environment for all visitors at all times to our beach.

The past season started earlier than usual on 20th September and concluded on the last Sunday of April which whilst this caused some concerns for the large number of patrol members involved in winter sports the willingness of the remainder to assist ensured that all patrols had large numbers with the requisite skill sets.

In all the 2012-13 was made up of 150 patrols spread over 74 days and the wettest Junior State Weekend in recent times. Based on the feedback of patrol members via the 2011-12 end of the season survey, we maintained the number of patrols at 14 but increased the numbers on each patrol to provide a better spread of the requisite competencies, thus enabling each patrol to be better equipped to do its job.

The increased numbers on patrols has worked well, allowing more patrols to take the opportunity to maintain and improve their surf life saving skills without compromising our core function, the safety of the general public. It has also allowed our Rookies to spend more quality time with their Buddies providing the optimum learning environment for our future lifesavers.

Umina Beach continues to be an increasingly popular spot for visitors from both within and from outside the Peninsula and a total 249,710 people visited the beach during the rostered patrol season.

During the past season we had 261 patrolling members made up of 211 bronze holders, 21 cadets and 29 rookies across the 14 patrols. We also welcomed the second Bronze training squad of 14 new “Bronze “members who due to the holding of the NSW State Championships were unable to qualify for patrols this season. We look forward to their added skills, enthusiasm and expertise boosting our patrols during the upcoming and many seasons thereafter. All of our patrolling members significantly contributed to our beach’s safety and to the statistics that were diligently recorded in both our logbooks and on Surf Guard which were.

- 9,275 patrolled Hours
- 249,710 visitors to our beach
- 9,708 Preventative Actions
- 52 Rescues
- 159 First Aids
- 4 Lost Children
- 1 Shark Alarms
- 7 beach closures

We cannot under state the value of our training department and the assistance and support that they provide to all patrolling members. Their dedication and expertise has helped us as a Club be prepared to meet the increasing popularity of our beach, they also trained an additional 39 new bronze members during the season, all of whom have taken to their patrols with the commitment and dedication of seasoned veterans.

Of significance is the ongoing retention of our Bronze holders particularly in our 15-21 years age group which is a tribute to the great work being done in the youth development area by people like Carl, Mick and Rick. The future of our club is our youth; we are reliant on their enthusiasm and zest for change and improvement to lead the next stage of our club's development.

Whilst there were some interesting moments at our beach that tested the skills and expertise of our patrolling members we had no major disasters and critically no loss of life. This is the result of the proactive commitment by all Patrol Captains and all patrol members to constantly improve their skills and to practice rescue and training scenarios as an integral part of their rostered patrols.

The commitment to personal improvement is also reflected in the very high numbers of Umina patrol members who attend formal surf training courses to keep up with the ever changing world of Surf Life Saving and the demands by SLA for members to be abreast and skilled in all required proficiencies. Our Club has perhaps the most highly qualified Life Savers on the Central Coast leading almost all of the awards categories. The quality of our training department and their dedication to their role is something that we do not take for granted and we sincerely thank Bob, Kevin and the whole team for their wonderful contribution to our members and the Life Saving movement.

At times the juggle to fit family, professional and surf commitments into members' schedules stretches us all to our limit and it is something that we should be aware off, keeping a balance in our lives so that we may perform at our best in each vital area.

This season we hosted the NSW State Surf Life Saving Championships which further stretched the commitments of our Life Savers, we are sincerely indebted to all who patrolled on the additional weekdays of the Championships. I have no doubt that with good planning, preparation and communication we will all be able to meet these extra challenges of next year's Championships providing another memorable experience for all who visit our beach.

In every organisation there are always a few people behind the scenes that go the extra mile to make sure things happen. Our club is indeed fortunate to have many of these wonderful people and is appropriate that they achieve the public kudos they deserve.

Our patrols would not have been as successful without the behind the scenes work of Andy Wing, and Larissa Dixon. They provide the essential backup that keeps everything working in an efficient and professional manner.

Paul Sharpe and Kerry Armstrong Smith have continued to maintain the focus on the traditional lifesaving events that has given many of our younger members an avenue of competition in Surf Life Saving that they may not have thought possible. These outstanding Champion Life Savers and First Aiders have also taken on leadership roles on their patrols passing on their skills for the benefit of all.

John Sharpe for his ongoing guidance, experience and knowledge which was critical for our organising team that have made the State Championships held at our beach a tremendous success for all who took part and attended.

Peter Saxby and Danny Cunningham for their commitment and dedication to Water Safety supported by many of our patrol members.

Brett, Carl and Mick for their work with the youth of our patrols, your efforts have been instrumental in maintaining the enthusiasm, commitment and focus of our wonderful young lifesavers and the tremendous growth in this critical section of our club.

Rick, Ashley and Tom for organising and leading the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze group of 30 of our younger patrol members. Your dedication and commitment to excellence in planning and execution will have a profound effect on these fortunate young members of our club and stand them in good stead for the rest of their lives.

Congratulations to all the members of Patrol 11 on winning Patrol of the Year. Dave and the team have set a very high standard over many years and were worthy winners of what was a very close competition.

Congratulations to all 75 of our 100% patrol attendance holders for managing to complete all of their rostered hours, which is no mean feat in lieu of the business of today's lifestyles. 28 of this group also managed to provide more than 60 patrol hours with 3 providing in excess of 100 hours of patrols.

Finally, congratulations to Christine Bishop and Savannah Paterson, our 2012-13 Patrol Persons of the Year. Savannah and Christine epitomises everything that surf lifesaving is about, prepared to go the extra mile to help others without any thought of recognition or personal self-interest. We hope Christine and Savannah that you are around to lead by your example and continue to contribute to the Club for many years to come.

The above is a brief overview of the achievements of our life saving activities over the past season, congratulations again to one and all. We hope our collective efforts will be enough to retain our club of the year status. We look forward to seeing you all again in September when we get to do it all over again.

COACHING REPORT

A wrap up of the 2012-13 coaching season.

2 main sessions were planned for during the week and they were Wednesday for board training and Friday for Iron man that I took. We started the season in cooler weather with most of the competitors wearing some form of wetsuit and usually by the end of these sessions it had been taken off.

These sessions were broken up into longer intervals with paddles to Ettalong point or Umina point, and numbers averaged around 8-12 people, as daylight saving was not operating these sessions were finished by 5.45 pm. Once the day light lasted longer the sessions increased in time to 1hour 15 minutes for both sessions and by the time day light savings had started I had introduced a functional exercise program which involved doing a series of exercise each time a competitor left the water and before going out on the next leg of training, this proved to be a great benefit to me as each person had a different reaction some falling over ,some being sick and some unable to finish off the next leg and as time went on each session became harder and harder this did not affect the numbers as the average grew to over 20 and stayed that high right up till state.

The sessions were planned on a monthly basis with 3 weeks of building and the 4 week of recovery and each month was harder than the last and when big seas were provided to us a buddy system was used with each person placed with another person to look out for and this work well as nobody was needed to be rescued by anybody on the beach, they were just picked up by their partner and taken back to shore. These sessions were a mixture of under 14 , seniors and masters with everybody having lots of fun and never anybody complaining about it being too hard, the season ran for 7 months and it was a pleasure to coach everybody and I would love to do it all again.

I would like to congratulate everybody who trained and raced we have had some very good results this year and hope to be back next year watching every one strutting their stuff on our beach.

SENIOR REPORT

Senior numbers swelled yet again this season. Competitively we started with NSW State Pool Rescue where Umina placed 4th overall – an outstanding result due in no small part to the large number of participants – 19 members – and great performances with 8 gold, 8 silver and 11 bronze. This is all the more remarkable as our members were only eligible to compete in 8 of the 14 age categories due to their youth.

Pool Rescue clinic was held at Lane Cove and 8 members attended on 13th-14th July where several high level coaches provided insight and instruction on specifics of these events.

The Australian Pool Rescue Championships were held in Adelaide where Umina placed 10th in the nation! Medallists in the Seniors were Rachel Wood 5 gold, Keisha Bovill 3 gold, 1 silver, 1 bronze, Jemma Smith 3 gold, 1 silver, Mollie Murphy 3 gold, 1 silver and Indigo Verhoeven 1 silver.

State Endurance Championships at Swansea on 28th Sep had much lower numbers from our Club than recent seasons but Jemma Smith; 'competing up' in U15 age group achieved gold in the 5km Beach run.

At the Mingara Pool challenge Umina's team again shone with our Club first in the Branch for the second year running.

Several members attended the Regional Surf and Kayak clinics as an introduction and exposure to the specifics of craft paddling. Although none made the squad, a couple were invited to attend the training sessions as part of development to future.

Branch saw our seniors attain 31 medals in team and individual events across regular and Lifesaving disciplines. This placed us third in the Branch.

At State on our home beach Umina fielded over 40 competitors across the categories. Many finalists with 1 gold and 3 silver amongst the senior ranks. Strong performances in the minor placing have meant our Club was third placed from our Branch and 18th overall.

At Aussies we had a much smaller representation than recent seasons in the Senior competition but still managed to have 2 medallists: Jemma Smith competing up in the U15 age group attained gold in Champion Lifesaver and Teigan Miller achieving silver in the U17 Champion Lifesaver.

On the Youth Development side members have commenced their Duke of Edinburgh, attended Youth Development camps, assisted with the Rotary Youth Exchange and assisted the Club in many fundraisers. Our Club is also fortunate to have many members classified as seniors continuing to perform patrol duties etc.

Sponsored Boards back to club

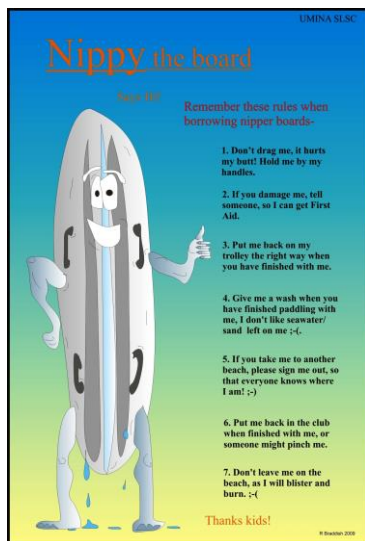
There are 2 nipper boards and 4 racing mals that were on a 3 year sponsorship that are due to be returned to the club before the start of 2013/14 season.

Duke of Edinburgh

The 2012-2013 Surf once again saw the reintroduction of the Duke of Edinburgh Awards (D of E) at Umina SLSC. Anticipation was high with 35 members signing up for the Bronze Award. Due to various reasons, the numbers fell to 28 participants.

The D of E consists of 4 components. Volunteer work (6months), Learn a new skill (3months), Perform Physical Activity (3months), & undertake an adventurous journey (before which a practice trip is to be undertaken). The first 3 have to be done on a regular basis with a minimum of 25 hours each for the volunteer section. To their credit, they far exceeded their target. A total of over 1300 hours of patrols & water safety were performed. That's an average of over 45 hours each. A truly remarkable effort. The new skills they acquired will assist the club in years to come. We now have 15 new First Aiders, 3 Bronze Medallions & 5 IRB crew/drivers. Most physical activity was revolved around Iron person training. All goes well for great competitive Surf. Our thanks go to Nick Shepherd; all patrol captains & their crews, Bob Powell, Mick Magurren, Carl Krucler & especially the parents, for helping the participants throughout the Surf.

Our practice journey was held at Patonga Camp Grounds. Participants walked from the club, to Patonga, via Pearl Beach. Before departing, participants were given tuition on food handling & preparation by Michelle Krucler. They were split into 3 groups with each group given a set menu. This they had to cook before departing. They were also given a brief course on map reading & compass work. A huge thank you to Kylieann Scott for her work in this area. We all camped overnight at Patonga. Following a sleepless night (thanks Josh) & a hearty breakfast, all participants were given instruction on how to handle a kayak. Everyone soon got the hang of it, especially how to fall out & drag a heavy water filled kayak to dry land. After packing up camp they walked the track back to the Surf club. Our thanks to the fathers who helped out.

The adventurous journey was held up at Gloucester, on the Barrington River. Following a bus trip up the coast, they arrived at Barrington to be fitted out for their trip down the Barrington rapids. Weather was cold & wet. Some of them were shivering before they even got into the water. However, after a bit of trepidation, they were off. Approx 3 hours later they arrived at The Steps camping ground. They were cold, tired & drenched. Only about 3 of them managed to complete the trip without falling off at one of the many rapids on the river. A fantastic effort by all, when you consider that a lot of them had never been in a kayak up until their practice trip. After staying at The Steps overnight, we packed up camp the following morning & made for Copeland State Forest. Here we undertook a 17 klm hike through the park. This is an area rich in history. It was formally a gold producing area. We learnt about how gold was extracted from the ground, especially at the entrance to the Hidden Treasure Mine. Soon we were back to the start &, after a short debrief, back on the buses for the trip back to Umina. A huge thank you to Mark Verhoeven, Gary Wilson, Mitchell Dean, Mick Magurren & Warren Whitney, who came along & performed water safety during the kayaking. Also a big hug to our camp supervisor, Mandy Boylan, who kept everything, & everyone, in line. A special thank you must go to Larissa Dixon. No matter what task we asked of her, she was only too happy to help. She was the one who sent out texts, arranged raffles & generally kept the lines of communication open so that everyone was kept informed.
