PRESIDENTS REPORT I STEPHEN SCAHILL

We have just experienced a season unique in the history of our surf club. From the devastating bushfires that impacted a number of member's families, to the unprecedented social impacts caused by COVID19. For Surf Life Saving the COVID impacts drew a premature end of the patrol season, placed our club under lockdown and caused the cancellation of the Australian Titles.

Trying circumstances also present an opportunity for the club and our members to be at their best. Driven by our volunteers, the club opened our doors to the community during the extended blackouts experienced locally. This provided a place for our members and the community to conduct activities we take for granted such as a warm shower or access power to charge devices. On Christmas Day, Life Member Danny Cunningham noticed an elderly couple who he described as "down on their luck" and offered them the use of club facilities for a shower to help brighten their day. I'm sure there are many similar examples that go unheralded, but through the challenges we faced we should feel great pride in how the members of our club continued to serve the community.

We entered the off-season ready to commence extensions to our club and determined to have this completed prior to the new patrolling season. Much credit must go to Greg Smith, who was the Director of Facilities at the time of the renovation and who worked so effectively with our builders, Homebrook Pty Ltd, owned by club members Dave and Christine Bishop. To complete an undertaking of this nature on time and on budget is a testament to the planning and work of all involved and has provided our growing membership with some much needed additional space.

The past offseason was also a time the club received some wonderful recognition. Having been named as consecutive winners of the Central Coast Club of the Year we headed to the State Awards optimistic in what we may achieve. To be named as the NSW Club of the Year was a culmination of so much hard work over a long period of time and I know this evoked much pride from members past and present. It was a wonderful piece of recognition for the members of our club. Congratulations to each of you.

For the second consecutive year, a patrol from Umina was also awarded the NSW Patrol of the Year, a fitting reward for the emphasis the club and our patrolling members continue to place on our lifesaving responsibilities.

A very special moment occurred a short time after at the Surf Life Saving Australia awards when Kai Darwin, the NSW Youth Life Saver of the Year was crowned the Australian Youth Life Saver of the Year. To be chosen as the most outstanding young lifesaver in Australia is an extraordinary honour, yet one all of our club understands Kai is so thoroughly deserving.

As always our core focus is on Life Saving. In our abbreviated season our patrolling members collectively logged 8,385 hours ensuring the safety of visitors to our beach. Our Director of Life Saving, Paul Sharpe once again led from the front with an extraordinary 163 patrolling hours. However, it was the quality of work from our lifesavers that proved so vital. Towards the end of the season we saw the emergence of fast running rips across our beach. A lasting memory will be visiting Umina Beach on a Saturday afternoon to see patrolling members stationed along the

beach all the way to “Kiddies Corner” encouraging swimmers to stay out of these rips and rescuing swimmers when these warnings were not heeded.

On this weekend 52 rescues were successfully conducted, a majority outside of our designated patrolled area. It is at times like this that we can all be grateful for the wonderful Patrol Captains that have developed such skilled patrolling units and the role our Education and Training programs play in providing the knowledge to our patrolling members. Without the initiative shown by our life saving leaders that weekend, we may have faced a dire outcome.

As a club we owe a great amount of gratitude to the Directors who very selflessly dedicate their time to ensuring the club continues to function so well. To Jenni Darwin, Bob Powell, Paul Sharpe, Harold Marshall, Greg Smith, Stuart Graf, Nicolien Yates and Skye Marshall on behalf of the membership we thank each of you for your unique contributions.

Whilst this is only a small example it speaks to the dedication of your directors: during the past off season your directors dedicated a Saturday to a strategic planning session. At this session your Directors agreed to open up the club on a Friday afternoon to the community with the dual purpose to become both more community facing, whilst developing an additional revenue stream. The initiative can be considered a wonderful success by both measures.

Whilst speaking of Directors, a special mention must go to Harold Marshall who, having completed the sporting season, stepped down from his role as Director of Surf Sports. Harold's contribution to this club is extraordinary and almost impossibly multi-faceted. There are very few areas of the club in which Harold does not make a contribution. At the end of the previous season Harold was named the Central Coast Volunteer of the Year. Rarely has an award been so well deserved.

Whilst the sporting calendar was denied its natural crescendo with the National Titles being cancelled, we were able to enjoy the State Carnival at Swansea Belmont for our Nippers, seniors and Masters. It was wonderful to see Umina so well represented in all carnivals and our dominance displayed in the traditional Life Saving events. A highlight of the carnivals was witnessing Life Member Kerry Armstrong-Smith march in the honorary party recognising the contribution of Women in Surf Life Saving. A fitting honour.

Our off-season this year has been different. We are yet to get together to celebrate the season's achievements via our Nippers or Senior Club presentations. Our Annual General Meeting has been delayed. We have opted to push back these events in the hope that restrictions continue to ease and we can once again come together in person to celebrate so much good that happens within our club.

Whilst we operate in uncertain times, I look forward to the 2020/21 season with great optimism, knowing our club and our members continue to shine bright irrespective of the challenges presented to us.

Stay safe, and to all of the wonderful members of Umina Surf Lifesaving Club we thank you for your contribution to our community.

DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION | JENNI DARWIN

It's been a challenging year with a number of new processes in place and the disruption Covid brought at the end of the season.

Firstly, my heartfelt thanks to both Jane in the office and Christine Lavers for their unwavering support in this space, simply getting things done and assisting with all things admin. The club would most certainly not be in the well run condition it is without these two leading from the front.

We moved our registrations fully online this year, a huge task and one that took a combined effort from the whole rego team. Thankyou to everyone who assisted on registration days to make this happen and start to reduce the admin load in the office.

We also engaged an IT company to move our server online, setting up Office 365 and sharepoint so that the board can access everything remotely and have a secure cloud based system to work with. We added generic email accounts for board members, enabling directors to change without changing emails and losing content, an important part of our succession planning.

We were also able to upgrade our office IT hardware with the aid of a grant, purchasing a laptop and docking station for office admin and thus providing an additional desktop for casual users. This meant that the laptop provided by SLSCC this year has been able to be utilised by the education team who access so much of their course content online now.

We once again were fully compliant and met all our obligations to legislation and our affiliation in 2019/20, a big step towards point score for the Club of the Year.

Member Services had some changes. A member welfare team was created and my thanks to those who have taken this on, took a mental health first aid course and supported our members in this space.

We continue to work hard in this area, which includes ensuring we are fully compliant with our child safeguarding obligations. My thanks to Meena James for taking on the task of verifying the Working with Children checks and to Julie Fayers for her huge contribution as the club Member Protection Officer.

Youth Development:

Our Duke of Edinburgh program had grand plans for the bronze and silver group adventures, unfortunately put on hold for the moment. A big congratulations to the kids who achieved Gold

this year – Grace Talty, Maddie Scahill, Lilly Perry, Liam and Ethan Cali - a remarkable effort from everyone involved.

My thanks to Lyndi Leggett for her unwavering enthusiasm to get the kids to challenge themselves and step out of their comfort zone.

We again ran a Rotary Exchange Surf Fun afternoon – thanks to all our young people who helped out with this. I know the exchange students had a fantastic afternoon in the surf.

We had several young club members attend SLSCC Youth programs. Congratulations to Erin Scahill, Maia Darwin, Kai Darwin and Bethwyn Caller who got selected on onto the SLSCC leadership program and Jarryd Edmonds, Shelly Smith, Matt Calbert and Kai Darwin who were facilitators for some of the youth programs.

There certainly was no off-season this past year in the facilities space. Club extensions kicked off at the end of May and we were thrilled that they were completed well in time for our patrolling season.

We are very appreciative of the commitment and expertise demonstrated by Greg Smith to work so closely with our builders Dave and Christine Bishop, whose company delivered a fantastic result for our club. The extension is absolutely seamless and is entirely in keeping with the existing club.

The extensions have also allowed us the opportunity to make some configuration changes which has seen an improved location of the First Aid room that is now far more easily accessible to Ambulance and Emergency Services should they need to be called. A relocated and extended cool room is now better equipped to support the social and commercial activities upstairs at the club.

We have also made great strides in making our beach more accessible for all members of the community with the new deck and lookout now wheelchair accessible. We now have a concreted access track linking with removable matting, which is laid during the summer months, markedly improving the ease of access for wheelchairs onto the beach.

Following the completion of the extensions Greg Smith stood down from his role of Director of Facilities and Stuart Graf has ably stepped into the role and continues to oversee maintenance and make improvements to our club- Stephen Scahill

Well that's a wrap for another patrolling season at Umina SLSC. The Red & Yellow Flags came down for the last time in the 2019/20 Season on Sunday 28 March 2020, signifying the end to a challenging but successful season. The Red & Yellow Flags went up for the first time on Saturday 23 September 2019 and since then Umina members have patrolled every weekend and public holiday, through rain, hail and shine to ensure the safety of the general public who come down to enjoy the best beach in Australia.

Firstly, I want to take this opportunity to thank every Umina SLSC member who spent their time on the beach patrolling this season. We are first and foremost a Surf Life Saving Club, and our core business is patrolling. Without our patrolling members, our club couldn't exist. Each member's contribution to patrols played a part in Umina SLSC maintaining its proud record of 'No Lives Lost'.

The season started off in typical fashion with the core lifesaving team drawing a short breath between the 2018/19 season ending and the planning and preparation for the current 2019/20 season commencing..

Umina SLSC Lifesaving Committee

This season for the Umina SLSC Lifesaving Committee was one of success. At the end of last season the club winning the SLSCC Branch Patrol Efficiency Competition and Patrol 12 being successfully named SLSNSW Patrol of the Year, the club winning both awards two years in a row. Another great achievement was seeing Kai Darwin being named Young Surf Lifesaver at SLSCC, SLSNSW and SLS Australia. Congratulations Kai.

Lifesaving as a whole continues to grow every year and I have been extremely fortunate to be supported by such a talented and dedicated team behind me. It is often said that 'volunteers don't necessarily have the time, but they have the heart', and this group of people exemplify that. The Lifesaving Committee was composed of a small group of dedicated patrolling members who each took on an area of responsibility within Lifesaving at Umina, in addition to their regular patrol duties. The committee met regularly to discuss our current operations and shape the future direction of Lifesaving at Umina SLSC.

I wish to personally thank Kai Darwin, James Irwin, Matt Calbert, Robert Powell and all the patrol captains who all worked very hard within their roles this season and made great contributions to the club.

Patrols

Patrols were kept very busy this season with overall beach attendance up from last season.

Combined, our members volunteered an incredible 8,3850 patrol hours this season. To place that in perspective, that's in excess of 430 days of combined patrolling hours. This constant diligence saw Preventative Actions up by 4000 to 12632 and ensued that we continued our record of no lives lost between the flags at Umina.

The 2019/20 Season saw our members undertake in excess of 113 rescues, with more than half of those using a rescue tube or rescue board. We attended to more than 152 first aid incidents and reunited more than 20 lost children with their parents. The season saw us perform 127 first aids during patrol hours, a marked increase from previous seasons, and numerous outside of our rostered hours.

Thanks to Water Safety Coordinator Simon Darwin for the nipper season.

I couldn't function in my position as Director of Lifesaving, and patrols couldn't function effectively without the support, guidance and professionalism of our Patrol Captains

Thanks must go to our Patrol Captains, Robert Powell, Kerry Armstrong –Smith, Jacqui Knight, Ashlee Dean, James Irwin, John Bowyer, Duncan Way, Steve Thomas, David Bishop, Skye Marshall, Rick Boylan, David Gaffney, Mollie Murphy who are always first on the beach and last off the beach on any given patrolling day.

Patrol Audits

Every patrol's favourite occasion. They approach in their unsuspecting blue shirts and clipboards on any random occasion. As part of Surf Life Saving Central Coast (SLSCC) Patrol Audit Program, Umina SLSC was audited 3 times throughout the season. These audits are to ensure we as a patrolling club are upholding our lifesaving agreements in regards to our personnel, our operating standards and competency in resuscitation and rescue availability. All our patrols have achieved great results,

Education

At Umina, we wouldn't have new patrolling members or sufficient patrols without the tireless work of our education team, led by our Director of Education Robert Powell. Robert and his education team have trained 30 new Bronze Medallion members and 22 new Surf Rescue Certificate members who have enthusiastically joined our patrol teams this season. Robert has been a mentor

and personal friend over the years at Umina. I wish to thank him for his selfless service to the club as Chief Instructor over the past 14 seasons.

Final Word

As the sand settles on the 2019/20 Season I want to take this final opportunity to thank our Patrolling members on another successful season. Umina SLSC maintained its proud and longstanding record of no lives lost, and I think we managed to have a bit of fun along the way.

I look forward to seeing everyone back on the best beach in Australia next season and wish everyone a safe and enjoyable off season.

Very disrupted season reflecting on our club's 2019/20 education plan, all courses starting after Christmas have been affected, firstly due to poor weather with big swell, then pollution and debris coming out of the Hawkesbury river, and finally the ongoing impact of the Covid-19 virus. There are about 30 members waiting to complete their SRC, Bronze Medallion and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) courses. Those members will be contacted when appropriate and safe to resume training.

Branch courses have also been affected; Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (SMAR) courses only run when Daylight saving has finished (Due to night rescue work requirements). SMAR, Silver Medallion Beach Management (SMBM) and Spinal Management courses were also cancelled when the virus hit, and we had good numbers enrolled in all these courses.

Our club had planned to run a First Aid (AID) course in June/July but due to the Corona virus this will not run, SLSNSW has put out a directive that if your First Aid certificate expires during the shutdown period your certificate, for lifesaving purposes only, will remain active. We will program a course as soon as recommencement of Surf Lifesaving activities permit.

Special mention to those who have been training hard and then attended the Gold Medallion Advanced Lifesaving assessment at Wamberal in March. This course is SLSA's premier award, which requires a very high level of fitness and skill (25-minute mission plus numerous other physical and theoretical challenges). Congratulations to Dean Tetley, Bronte Smith and Jemma Smith on successful completion. There are other members from Umina who are training towards completion next year.

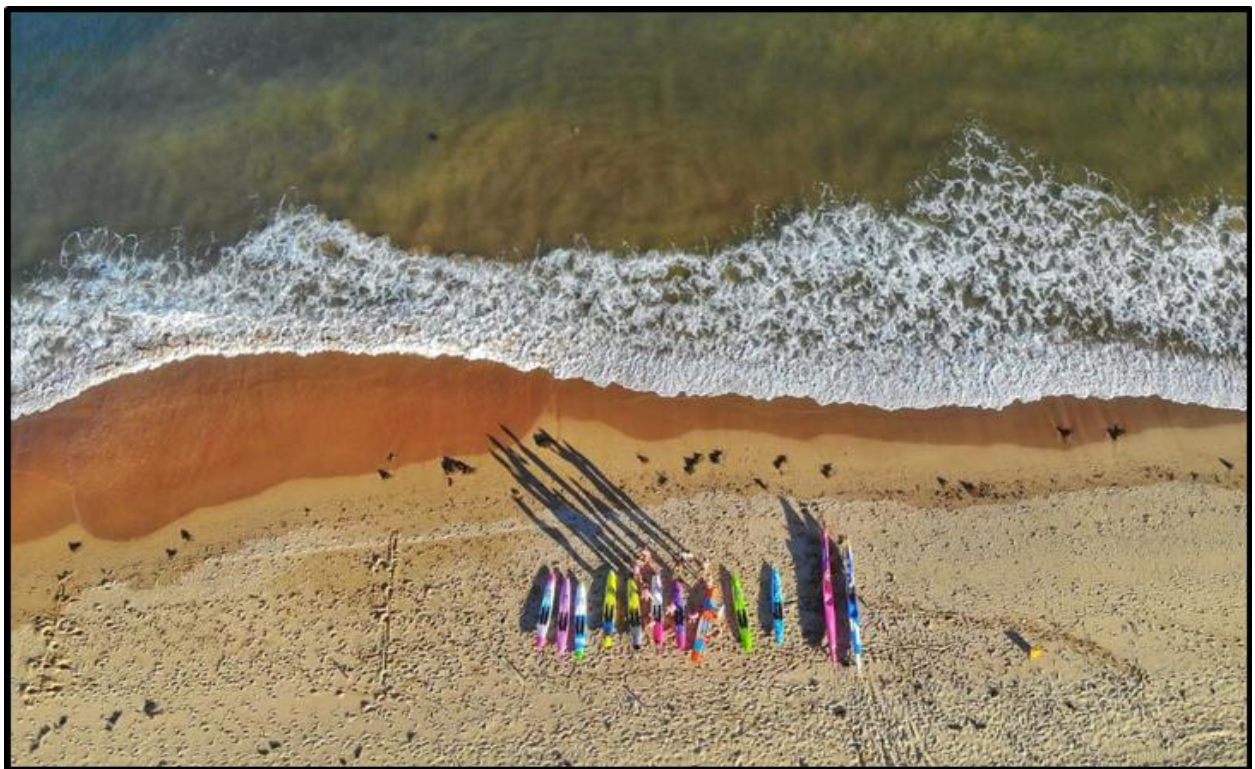

These events test the overall lifesaving skills of competitors with a theory test paper, a live patient assessment, resuscitation, and physical events.

We ran an internal competition for our champion lifesavers to get an experience of the event before competing in the branch championships. We were only able to complete the theory components of the two events at the branch championships as the physical component was cancelled due to the weather, but the team enjoyed the experience and represented the club well.

The following week was the state championships, we had 13 champion lifesaver representatives and the champion patrol team compete. From these 14 entries, the team came home with 11 medals, which included 9 Aussie's qualifications which reflects the effort each member of the team put in throughout the season. Although disappointingly we did not get to compete at the Aussies, to be in the top 9 of Australia is a massive achievement for all those who qualified.

These results could not have been achieved without the officials and patients who volunteered at these events. So, a massive thank you to Katherine Miller, Karen Murphy, Sue Halliday, Shelley Smith, Chis Halliday, Pam Edmonds, Kevin Armstrong, Kerry Armstrong-Smith, Lucy Caller and Julie Fayers.

The kids were incredibly competitive throughout the season, particularly in the surf events, and have made lots of friends from clubs all over the State. We had mixed conditions at the carnivals with flat conditions at Umina, stingers at Terrigal, and tough conditions at Wamberal when Levi, Ayden, Liliana and Slater had a go at their first Iron Person. Like last season, our kids competed with big smiles on their faces and displayed great sportsmanship, even when things went against them. Umina has a great reputation around the country for its attitude and respect for others, and our group of kids certainly reinforce those values. We had some awesome achievements in individual and team events, coming away with plenty of medals at Branch and points for the club at State (with several State finalists), narrowly missing out on medals.

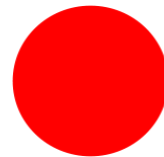

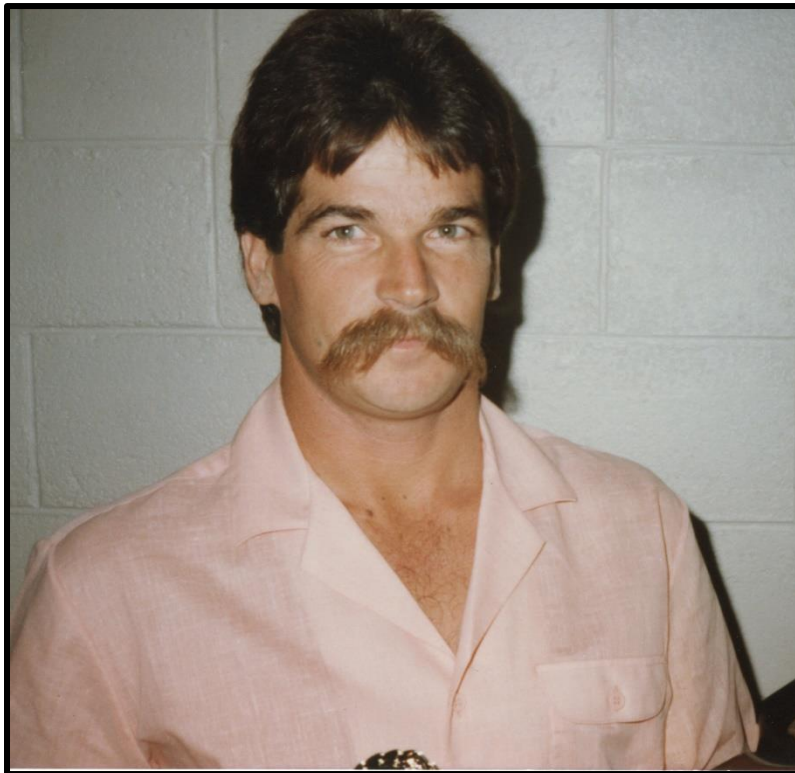
