LIFE MEMBERSHIP-SLSA

This week at The Aussies 2022, Brett was officially inducted into Surf Life Saving Australia Life Membership.

Brett has made a sustained and distinguished contribution to SLS as President of Umina SLSC, Surf Life Saving Central Coast, Surf Life Saving New South Wales and as a Director of Surf Life Saving Australia. As a SLSA Board member, Brett chaired and facilitated working groups that implemented a number of lifesaving initiatives that have been implemented nationally by SLSA and other states.

Brett achieved the SLSA strategic goal of financial sustainable by securing \$24 million to build 8 new surf lifesaving clubs, allowing them to generate revenue and engage with the local community.

Further to this Brett expanded surf lifesaving services by leading and managing the implementation of the commercial operations of SLSNSW services that included the lifeguard and commercial training of SLSNSW.

Other significant achievements included developing the Standard Operating Procedures for lifesaving services and a state-wide emergency services response system which created a national best practice standard; introduction of the 13SURF 24-hour rescue call out service; developing a national event venue selection matrix which enabled a review of venues against a criteria to determine its suitability to conduct events as well as a revised bid hosting criteria and agreements.

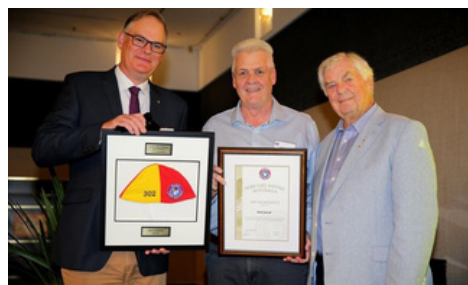
In addition to all of this, it's Brett's 46 years of membership in Australia's most iconic volunteer movement where he has found joy, connection and most definitely made a difference. He has created wonderful friendships from all around Australia and overseas, had opportunities for personal development through mentoring and participation, seen and been involved with some of the greatest athletes and water people in the world and been involved in the development of the world's best lifesaving technology and resources.

15 years after he was a part of a group that created the surf lifesaving tagline, "create great Australians and build better communities", he believes it is still so relevant and exactly what we do or aspire to do. He sees this take place through training, saving lives in the aquatic environment, developing athletes, creating health and fitness pathways and providing development for youth and nippers.

Brett would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those who you have been a part of his journey in surf lifesaving.

And to finish off his time at The Aussies 2022, with an induction into SLSA Life Membership, also comes the honour of sitting front and centre in the VIP area at North Kirra beach for finals day!!

PRESIDENTS REPORT

STEPHEN SCAHILL

The 2021–22 season was another highly successful year for our club, culminating in the recognition as the Central Coast Surf Life Saving Club of the Year.

On patrol we saw the seamless transition of Mollie Murphy assuming the position of Director of Life Saving as Paul Sharpe stepped away due to his commitments with NSW Surf Life Saving. Paul has been so instrumental in all things Life Saving in our club for so long. It was therefore more than a little daunting to commence a season without him in the role. However the leadership from Mollie has exceeded all expectations and along with the wonderful work of our Patrol Captains we once again provided the highest level of care and quality of patrol to all visitors to our beach.

The work of our Life Savers has been rightfully recognised in many ways including:

- Umina – the winner of the Branch Patrol Competition Award
- Kerry Armstrong-Smith awarded the Patrol Captain of the Year for the Central Coast
- Mollie was selected as the clubs “Members Choice” Award for her work supporting Patrols as well as the fantastic work she has done with our Youth programs.

Other winners at the Central Coast branch awards included Mollie Murphy for her work with Youth Engagement, Pam Edmonds as the Trainer of the Year and in a very special moment Lauren Summerhayes was awarded the Branch President’s Award for outstanding service to the Central Coast branch.

Away from patrol, both our Senior Athletes and Nippers experienced a heavily disrupted sporting season with many carnivals and events being canceled often due to surf conditions then a series of water quality issues towards the end of the season. Only our very young athletes – Under 9’s–12’s had the opportunity to participate at a State Level. There is some tremendous young talent in the club and the work of our Junior Coach – Steve Murphy and our Head Water Coach Trevor Gee continues to develop this talent and offer pathways for our youth.

Our senior athletes were grateful to have the opportunity to compete at the Australian Titles on the Gold Coast and all acquitted themselves brilliantly.

This year saw the commencement of what we hope will be a long term partnership with United Petroleum and Pie Face. United has come on the Major Sponsor of our sports program and as part of this support they are also offering our members discounted fuel which provides both the member a discounted price as well as a rebate paid to the club. We are very grateful for their support, as we are from all of our sponsors.

We also recognise the wonderful partnerships we have with Diggers and Bendigo Bank as Major Partners and encourage you to support these businesses when able.

This year also saw some changes to our Directors with Rick Boylan, Rebecca Simonet, Wendy Cook and Mollie Murphy joining existing Directors of Skye Marshall, Jarryd Edmonds and Stuart Graf. There have been some challenging periods over the past 12 months, exacerbated at the time by lockdown rules and our inability to meet face to face. I'm very grateful to the perseverance and resilience shown by this team as they were required to donate more hours than ever before to ensure the club continued to operate in trying circumstances.

A special mention to Skye Marshall who finishes her tenure as Junior Activities Co-ordinator. Between Skye and Harold they have held this post for almost the entirety of the Nippers journey of their three children. They are both extraordinary volunteers and indeed the previously mentioned partnership with United would not have happened without Harold. I sincerely hope their example inspires others to become further involved in our great club.

A mention also needs to be made of our wonderful junior coaches. Led by Steve Murphy, he has been so ably assisted by a number of volunteers, with a particular mention to Rob McLeod and Kerry Armstrong-Smith who have given up their time and expertise long after their own children ceased being involved at the junior level.

DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION

It has been a huge learning curve for me over the last 8 months since I started in this position last November. Whilst I am new to this position, I am also a new member to the club with my daughter starting her Nipper journey this year in the under 6. Since joining I have appreciated the warm welcome, ongoing advocacy and encouragement I have received from the board of directors and members.

This season the role was initially held by Amy Magurren whom stepped down early due to unforeseen circumstances. We appreciate Amy for supporting the club at this time. Also a big thank you to Christine Lavers who stood in to care take this position before I was onboarded and has continued to support me whilst I got my head around the clubs processes and procedures.

Due to covid, registrations were again all completed online this season with support from our Registrars Jane and Christine via phone and email. Whilst SLSA continue to make changes to the members online registration portal I have to recognise the enormous amount of effort the Registrars and Jenni Darwin have made to implement the processes for all members through this channel over the last 2 years.

The team have spent many hours making updates to the constitution and by-laws which unfortunately were not passed at the Special General Meeting held in May due to not meeting the quorum, this will be scheduled to address for endorsement at the next Special General Meeting.

Our member protection officers and our Club Chaplin Arthur Pearce continue to work judiciously with our members when required. We are very grateful that we have the support of these individuals to assist and be available when they are needed.

The Duke of Ed was another program that was regrettably not able to find traction to progress this season with the ever changing conditions of covid and natural disasters. It is also with great sadness that Lyndi Leggett has announced she will be stepping down as the Duke of Ed Manager this season, whilst not getting the opportunity to work with Lyndi directly myself I know this is a great loss to the club as she has been running this program since the 2018/2019 season. We would like to thank Lyndi for all her effort, support and inspiration she has given to the club and the youth that have been involved in this program over the years.

Our public social media pages continue to grow their following, with our posts being shared within the community by our sponsors, politicians and community awareness groups giving our club great exposure. Thank you to Harold Marshall and Shelley Smith for continuing to take the time to build and post content in times of relevancy and in line with our clubs values.

Lastly, I would like to thank Jane, Christine and Wendy who spend hours every week meeting and taking calls from me to maintain the administration of the club.

What a challenging year we have had with further Covid regulations, and extreme weather we needed to assess club expenses due to low income. While the clubs accounts have held thanks to good financial planning and support through loyal sponsors and supporters and function when able this year saw our return at a minimum for the first time in many years.

The clubs' financials have been audited by registered auditors Fortunity Pty Ltd.

With no one standing at the AGM for the Director of Finance Position Peter Todd offered to trial the position, but due to family commitments and time involvement in the position he was not able to continue. The club would like to thank him for his contribution. The Position was readvertised and due to a change in my circumstance I was reappointed in February.

We would like to thank all our sponsors without you many items needed such as Lifesaving equipment for patrolling, training and education, Patrol Meals for our Patrolling Members, equipment to run our Junior, Youth and Senior programs and the running of our member assistance program would not be possible without your support.

This year saw United / Pie Face come on board as a Platinum Sponsor and through their sponsorship we have been able to provide sun safe training rashies plus various other equipment. Ettalong Diggers continue to support us with our Educations and training programs, Bendigo Bank also continue with their support in the IRB department. Woy Woy Rotary's continued support. (They first started supporting Umina surf club in 1959 with the purchase of the Clubs first Surf Boat call ZOT).

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING

Well, this season was certainly a challenging one. Despite the challenges, it was once again a successful season with our core goal of “No Lives Lost” being maintained at Umina SLSC. I’d firstly like to start by thanking every single patrol member. You all stood on the beach this season, in what was arguably one of the toughest, with bad weather, covid, and the reopening of our world interfering, thank you for turning up and ensuring our community was safe every weekend.

Patrols

We started the season with many covid restrictions which saw our patrol captains having to narrow their patrol down to six members and manage the busy beach with exercise at the beach being of only a few activities people could do. Masks had to be worn at all times, QR codes scanned and loads of hand sanitiser. After a few weeks, restrictions began to ease and we saw our patrols return to their normal sizes and the rookies join in. We had 30 new rookies join our patrols across our patrol teams, who by all accounts were incredible at listening, learning and being proactive on patrol.

Over the Christmas holidays, if the sun was shining, the beach was insanely busy and the challenging rips which formed over the winter saw patrol members spread along the beach performing many preventions and rescues. The rain and debris of the closing months of the season meant the beach was closed a lot and patrol days were long, but training and cleaning kept patrol members busy.

This season our members completed:

7,459 patrol hours with 189,443 beach attendees

3,646 preventions

50 first aids

101 rescues

All contributing to maintaining “No Lives Lost” between the flags at Umina SLSC.

A huge thank you to Jon and his cafe team for providing lunches every weekend, on those cold and miserable days, it was definitely a highlight of our day.

Lifesaving Committee

I would like to thank our lifesaving committee for all of your support this season. Stepping into this role was quite intimidating but with the expertise of our lifesaving committee, it definitely made it easier. Thank you to Paul for teaching me the ways of this role and answering all of questions. Jimmy had a wild season with many IRB issues and dealt with my complete lack of IRB knowledge. Andy did all of our SSV inductions at the start of the season and maintained all of our motor vehicles. And finally my dad for not only keeping the boards in tack and making sure I buy a rescue board with every grant that comes in, but I really couldn't have done this without him, all the calls to go fix things when I wasn't around, the tons of last minute IRB driver subs and thanks to my mum for letting me pull dad away and leave her at home alone on the weekends. Thank you to our patrol captains and vice captains, each challenge that came up throughout the season you embraced and led your teams to succeed. Thank you for your support, sharing of ideas and guidance, without you all our patrols couldn't function.

Our committee have already started working on our plan for 2022/23 and it's looking to be an exciting one.

Call out Team

Our call out team respond to incidents 24/7, a key part of surf lifesaving being an emergency service. Thank you to our entire call out team for being ready and available to respond to incidents.

We had members of our call out team respond to locations to assist with flood rescues and preventions. Thank you Jarryd, Harold, Simon and Steven as well as Kai for getting everyone organised.

Youth Trips

A highlight of the season was taking our youth members away to Kiama and Bondi. The youth took every opportunity to learn and grow and got to experience a range of lifesaving aspects from being patrol captains, managing busy beaches and support operations. Thank you to both Bondi SLSC and Kiama SLSC for providing such great hospitality and support for our trips. We are looking forward to growing these next season.

Thank you to everyone on that stood on the beach this season, it was a tough one but successful, maintaining Umina SLSC long-standing record of no lives lost on the beach. Enjoy the off-season and see you on the beach in September!

Lastly, I would like to thank everyone that has assisted me in anyway and I look forward to a bigger better 22/23 competing as one under the black, white and blue cap.



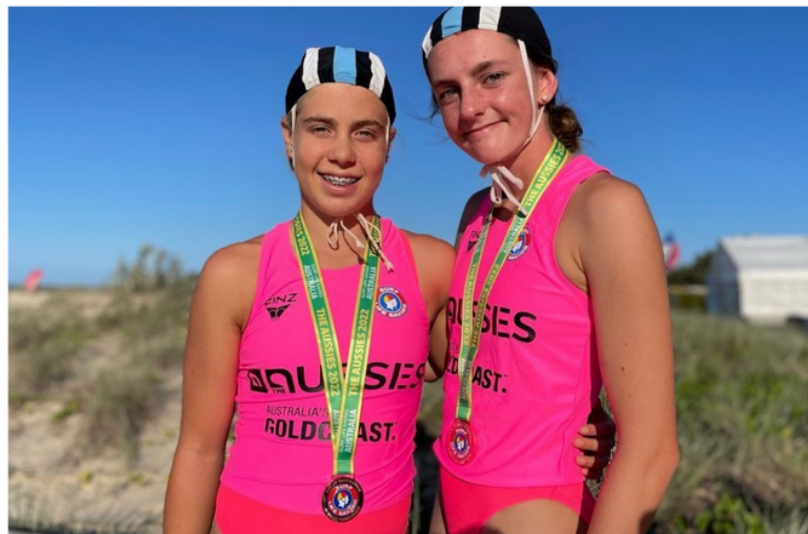
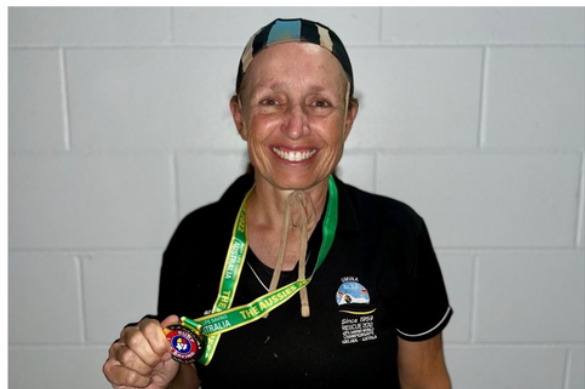

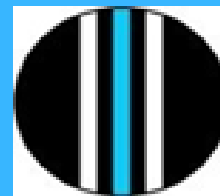

Congratulations to Matilda Lawrence for placing 1st in Champion Life Saver at Branch.

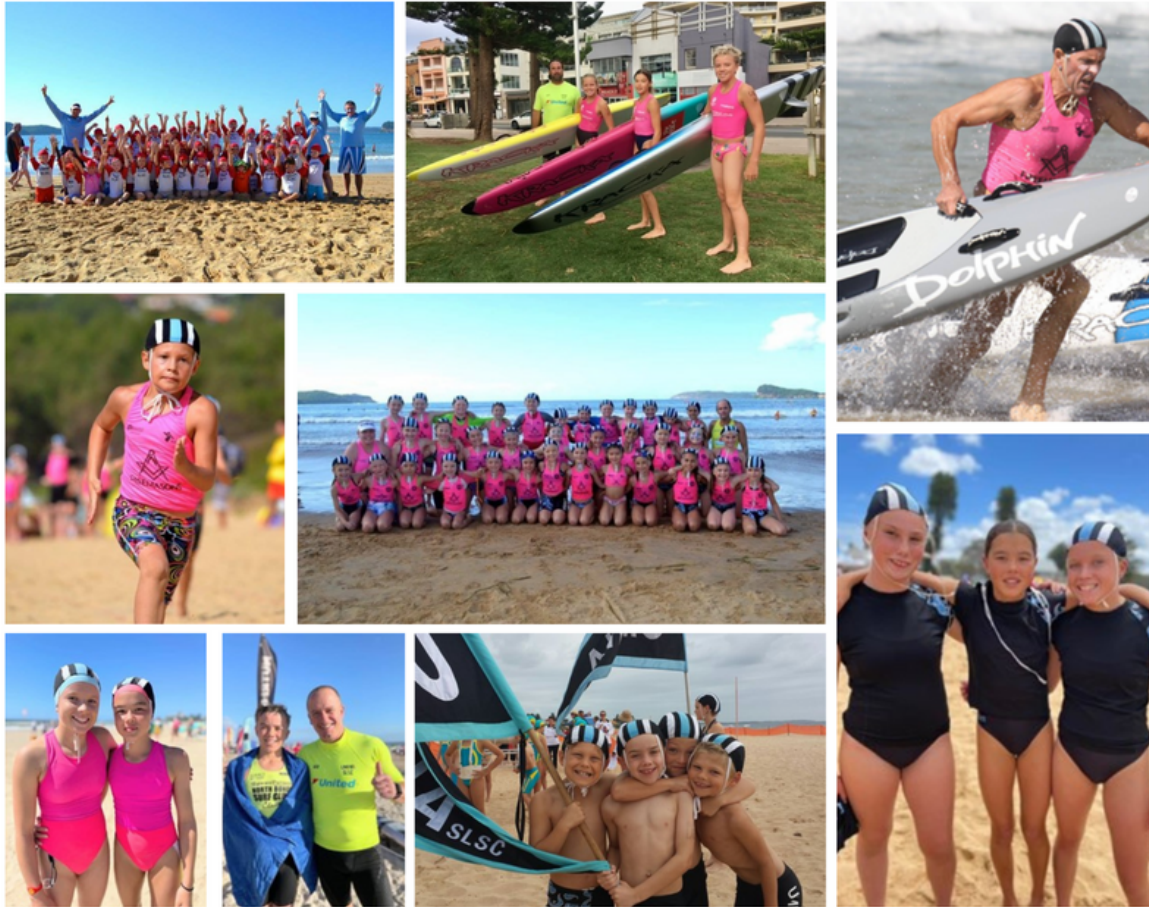

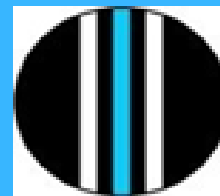

As they move into the U13's , I know they are looking forward to finally getting on Patrol and being given the chance to use their lifesaving skills.

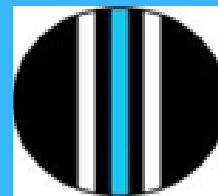
My thanks go out to the parents for bringing them to the beach each week and for help with water safety, officialing etc.

Champion Patrol covered theory component, resuscitation, swim team, swim-tube-board rescue relay and a patrol scenario. The energy and passion this team showed at Aussies was second to none. First Aid scenarios were extremely challenging and when up against the best in the country, it's always a nervous wait for the results. One scenario involved a patient with a stingray penetration wound, a lost tooth and suffering from hypothermia. Another patient had diabetes (hypoglycaemia) and the final patient had a bee sting and was anaphylactic.
