The 2022-23 season was one which saw us return to some form of normality following the past few interrupted seasons. It was great that the restrictions that had been placed on our patrols, nippers and club house were lifted and we safely returned to the numerous activities around the club.

Under the guidance of Mollie Murphy as the Director of Lifesaving, our patrols ran smoothly, capably managing the high number of visitors to our beach. It is a credit to Mollie and our Patrol Captains for how consistently well our patrols are conducted. It is no coincidence that Umina continues to score at the very top end of all patrol audits conducted by branch. These reviews are conducted without notice and across various patrol teams, yet we consistently achieve outstanding results.

Training and Education has long been a strength at our club and this has continued under the leadership of Damon Somerfield. In addition to the formal education pathways, Damon has introduced a number of club activities. Damon deserves great credit for his "Love Squad" program that provided some surf training and general fitness for our members. We also saw some great participation in our "Yellow Board" program led by Damon and Steve Murphy. This program is designed to provide coaching to bronze members in developing their skills on rescue boards. Both of these initiatives provide a wonderful opportunity to improve the overall skills and rescue-readiness of our members.

Whilst relatively new to our club, Damon's passion for the club and surf life saving more broadly is infectious and our members are very grateful for his ongoing contribution. The additional activities and training opportunities also had a direct impact on us having a record number of Masters competitors participate in our branch championships. Well done to Rick Boylan for all the encouragement and co-ordination to make this happen.

Whilst the focus of our nippers program is to provide surf awareness and develop the skills and confidence of our children, the competition results at the State Titles deserve comment. There are many individual results that warrant recognition, however no event better epitomises the current strength of our junior program than the All Age Board relay in which the club achieved a Silver medal. A few short years ago that felt absolutely impossible as we marveled at some of the powerhouse clubs across the state. It is a testament to Steve Murphy and his support team as well as the efforts of our water safety.



The foundation of our successes in the nippers program has come from having such strong participation numbers. This can only occur when the kids are enjoying what they do. Michael Jordan and his team of Age Managers deserve great credit for developing a program that keeps the kids engaged and involved.

Michael has ensured there is a focus on fun and enjoyment on a Sunday morning, whilst providing the opportunity for children of varying abilities to develop their skills and surf awareness. We have seen over the past few years that this has resulted in an influx of new rookies as they finish their nippers journey and get to experience patrols. This injection of youth places the club in a fantastic position for our ongoing patrolling capabilities.

The role of Director of Facilities can be very demanding as there is much to do to simply maintain the club. Thanks must go to Stuart Graf for not only the work he has done in fixing the various matters that need attention over the course of a season but for some of the improvements he has overseen at the club. Installing the electric roller doors has improved our emergency response time and also created a safer environment for our patrolling members. Stuart should also be commended for the work he has done upstairs with the retractable window frames further adding to the ambience of the club.

Whilst many of the activities around the club are highly visible, some work critical to the functioning of the club happens largely behind the scenes. Two of our Directors in Wendy Cook and Bec Simonet are responsible for the lion's share of this work and as our club we are indebted to them for their commitment and contribution. Rather appropriately Wendy Cook was recognised in a SLSA initiative highlighting significant contribution to life saving called the "Discovering Hidden Legends" program. Both Wendy and Bec have been integral in the administration of the club.

As a volunteer organisation we have a significant dependence on the support of our sponsors in order to continue to provide services to the community. We are grateful for the large number of businesses that support our club and want to pay particular thanks to our Major Sponsors in United/Pie Face, Ettalong Diggers and Rotary. This season was once again a successful one with our core goal of "No Lives Lost Between the Flags" being maintained at Umina SLSC. This season saw lovely weather and plenty of beachgoers enjoying the sunshine, along with plenty of rips that continue to be a challenge. I'd firstly like to thank each patrol member from our rookies to patrol captains, thank you for being on the sand and in the water, ensuring our community was safe every weekend.

Patrols

After a rocky end to last season with so much rain and poor water quality, it was a pleasure to have the sunshine for most of the 2022/23 season. With sunshine comes beach goers, over 300,000 beach attendances across the 72 patrolling days. Our patrol members were kept busy all season with challenging rips and often surf. Our patrol teams were often seen spread along the beach in the red and yellow, performing rescues and prevention.

We had our U13 rookies join our patrol teams, who by all accounts were fantastic at listening, learning and being proactive on patrol. Many patrol team members also upskilled this season by completing a range of courses from SRC, First Aid, ARTC, IRB Crew, IRB Driver, Silver Medallion Patrol Captain and Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, thanks to our incredible education team led by Damon. These new skills have been and will continue to be so helpful in the strengths of our patrol teams.

This season our members completed:

9,021 patrol hours with 308,371 beach attendees 5296 preventions 78 first aids 50 rescues

All contributing to maintaining "No Lives Lost Between the Flags" at Umina SLSC. Rescues were down 50% on last year while preventions were up 45%, a massive achievement by all patrol members.

A huge thank you to Jon and his café team for providing lunches every weekend, from the busy days to miserable ones, it's always a highlight of our day.

Thank you to our patrol captains and vice captains, each challenge that came up throughout the season you embraced and led your teams to succeed. It's been an incredible honour to be part of the Umina SLSC leadership and Education team this year, I've been a trainer since 2016 so have always had a passion for this key area. As always my first thank you and acknowledgement goes to my family, as with like all our volunteers whom without the support and help to allow us to do what we do, none of this is possible, I'd would also like to thank all members for providing me with the encouragement and support to take on such a key role for our club.

When the opportunity to step into the Director of Education role came up, Jarryd Edmonds and I discussed how we could build on and develop our education and training programs further, having been in the role for the previous 4yrs and being one of our most qualified trainers, assessors and facilitators in NSW, Jarryd's knowledge and experience has been exceptional for both our members and myself as the new incumbent.

We started the season with a recruitment drive and piloted a new online sign up process to minimise the administration and make it easier for new members when joining our club, and kicked off with an 8 week bronze medallion course which ran twice over the season, which included both the new First Aid qualification and the new advanced resuscitation awards, giving our club a gold standard 8 week course not many other clubs can deliver, this is down to the quality, skills and qualifications of our trainers and assessors (namely Jarryd Edmonds, Pam Edmonds, Matt Fearnley and Peter Sinclair to allow us to facilitate such a great program, this then fed into our SRC and SRC to Bronze training programs and IRB programs which also ran through the season.

This season the Education & Training trained, assessed and facilitated:

- 45 Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC'S) awards
- 31 Bronze Medallions and ARTs awards
- 15 SRC to Bronze awards
- 30 IRB Crew awards
- 3 IRB Driver awards

Other courses our team supported

- 2 SLSCC Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue courses
- 2 SLSCC Siver Medallion Patrol Captains courses





Skills Maintenance

Part of being an active member is maintaining your awards, with a skills maintenance refresher each season, with the introduction of the SLS assessment app, this is now completed on patrols for most Bronze holders, so thank you to our patrol captains for assisting in this areas and Mollie Muphy for working with the patrols captains and education team on this, a special thankyou to Pam and Jarryd's Edmonds who relentlessly jumped on all patrols ticking people off to maintain their advanced resuscitation

IRB Courses

In our power craft areas, we finished off an IRB Drivers course and facilitated 2 new IRB crew courses with the support of Kai Darwin, Brad Dawson, Matt Fearnley under the leadership of Jarryd Edmonds.

With 30 new IRB crew members qualifying this season and now on patrols, it gives the club a strong base to develop and train the IRB section and drivers over the next few seasons.

A big call out to our only female IRB Driver Amber Backhouse who represented Umina IRB by joining the ALBERT program at Fingal Bay this season.

Amber joined 50 other female IRB Crew and Drivers from across NSW clubs with all levels of experience to develop skills and network with other clubs.

IRB training also continued through the winter with monthly training sessions for crew and drivers to spend time in the boat and maintain their awards.

Members continued their swim and board training opportunities and incorporated many tube starts into these sessions too. Friday Love Squad even had a couple of tube sessions where everyone got involved!!

His wife Anne was also involved in Surf Life Saving as a First Aid Officer had passed away a few years ago but they are both survived by their two sons Peter and Rob Lougher






Vale- Rose Murphy

She helped with many fundraising and social activities over the years selling raffle tickets at the local caravan park and bowling clubs.


Although never gaining a lifesaving award she was at the beach every weekend supporting the nippers at home beach or at carnivals.

Robert Cable more commonly known as "Bob" was a long time member of Umina SLSC but due to ill health in later years had to take a step down. Bob was a Bar Manager for Umina SLSC and had a fantastic collaboration with the Team of Bob Langford & Danny Cunningham.

The 3 of these gentlemen were so popular with the surf club that they were awarded the Stirrer's paddle in 1997/98.

Although Bob was never a patrolling member he gave many hours of voluntary service to the club. He leaves behind his beautiful wife Paula and his adult children Wes and Kate. Wes and Kate were active members of the surf club from nippers to seniors and are well known amongst the community.
